Let's talk numbers for this year:

•The cost to educate 1 child in our school is approx. \$ 5750.

(Our tuition is significantly lower than the cost to educate each child. Tuition increase did not even cover the percentage of teacher salary increases or utilities.)

Average Monthly cost of school utilities: \$4342.64.

(We all are experiencing utility increases in our homes.)

•BINGO give \$12,000 to the school EVERY month.

(Even during the months of COVID our bingo committee was able to continue to give \$10K a month. This is in addition to the money they give for special projects in the school.)

2022-2023 Textbooks cost the school \$42,443.10.

(Pre Covid digital programs were a 1/5 of the costs of print materials. Now digital is either added to the to the print and no option is given to opt out, or the digital costs the same as the print materials.)

Dear School Families & Parishioners:

Sending out this communication to be as transparent with our efforts for the picnic as we can.

To officially report on last year, we were able to generate around \$80,000. This is good but it could have been better. After evaluating our efforts, there were some opportunities (lessons learned) that we are trying to put into place for this year's planning to help us realize more profits.

We also had to deal with some rain (as usual) on Friday. However, Sunday was dry but temps were over 100 during the day and made for a miserable experience. These two weather factors had an impact to the overall ending dollar amount as well.

Now, for 2023. We are making some changes to the overall schedule of operation. The primary goal is to have more resources to tear down the picnic. For years, we have been doing this tear down on Monday morning and we consistently watch as the number of available people to help with this needed effort continues to decline year after year. As the "regulars" continue to age, the strain and stress on these same individuals has become too much. That is why we will be closing EARLY on Sunday. We will close at 6:00. HOWEVER, we will still staff all of the booths until our normal close time of 10:30. With making sure each of the booths are staffed, this will allow us to organize teams to work on tearing down various parts of the campus....with the goal to have just about everything done and loaded in the barn that night! We will still have the carnival and we will have bands on Friday and Saturday night. We will still have the cabbage rolls and a chicken dinner.

There are some booths/areas that are in need of a new chair. If you are interested, please call/text me at 618-954-8323 with your interests. Anyone that decides to fill these roles, I will help facilitate any knowledge transfer to help you with your efforts.

Staying the same:

- School families will be required to work 12 hours at the picnic. Each chairperson will be tracking and submitting hours to Loretta Joyce for accurate accounting.
- We still need **parishioners** to be able to donate their time as well. The picnic is a **parish** function, not a school function. We cannot be successful without all of you!







Job Search Training Session Series at 2001 Delmar Avenue

Secretary of State and State Librarian Jesse White awarded nearly \$6 million in pandemic recovery grants to libraries focused on responding directly to the COVID-19 pandemic by modifying services, transforming spaces and developing resources for their local recovering workforce. Funding 211 academic, school, special and public libraries, all of which received grants ranging from \$5,000 to over \$1 million. A combination of funding sources


provided through the federal American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) and Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA), both from the Institute of Museum and Library Services, and state technology funds were used to maximize the statewide impact.


