Sunday's Mass Readings

Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time – 27 February 2022

Sirach 27:4-7. Psalm 92:2-3, 13-14, 15-16. 1 Corinthians 15:54-58. Luke 6:39-45.

Believing in the Resurrection of the Dead. We have been reading and hearing Saint Paul to the Corinthians since the middle of January. He proclaims the resurrection of Jesus as victory over death. This belief, this word from the creed – “he...rose again on the third day” – is central to faith. It lays the foundation for our own being raised one day because death is not the end of us. We say in faith each Sunday: “I look forward to the resurrection of the dead.”

- ◆ Even though November is past, how can I still remember the dead? For whom will I pray? Whom among them will I ask to pray for me?
- ◆ How am I preparing now for my own resurrection from the dead at some later time?
- ◆ How will I act and speak in this life knowing that there is life to come after death?

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Pope Francis wrote of our need not only to care for people with disabilities but also "to ensure their 'active participation in the civil and ecclesial community'" (Fratelli Tutti, no. 98).

People with disabilities in Belarus face challenges of social isolation, especially if they rely on wheelchairs. If they lack close relatives, friends, or guardians to help them, they can find it difficult to access services, information, and accessible transportation. As a result, they often lack the opportunity to build relationships, work in groups, and meet their social and spiritual needs. These challenges become even greater in times of disruption, such as the political unrest and protests surrounding the national elections in Belarus in 2020 and continuing into 2021.

The Tabita program- an initiative begun in June 2018 that is run by Caritas Belarus and supported through funding from the Collection for the Church in Central and Eastern Europe- assists people with disabilities by bringing them together to socialize, share their experiences, and pray in an environment where volunteers, as well as a volunteer coordinator and a part-time social worker, are available to assess and assist participants with their physical, social, psychological, and spiritual needs.

When you support the Collection for the Church in Central and Eastern Europe, you help programs like Tabita break down the walls of isolation separating people with disabilities from the community and from each other.

Please be generous to the collection, because your support helps the Church in Belarus alleviate the loneliness and isolation facing people with disabilities. Consider giving at Mass or through your parish online giving platform. #iGiveCatholicTogether also accepts funds for the collection.

BLACK HISTORY MONTH -DID YOU KNOW?



St. Josephine Bakhita was born in Sudan in 1869 to a prosperous family. She was kidnapped by Arabic slave traders. They renamed her Bakhita, which means "fortunate" in Arabic. Once taken, she was forced to walk over 600 miles to the place of her auction. During her captivity, she was bought, sold, and given away several times. She was introduced to the church when she was working as a nanny in Italy and accompanied the child to school. When the family tried to take Bakhita away from Venice, she looked to the courts and fought for her freedom. A judge not only declared her free, but stated that according to law, she had been free since 1885. Imagine the paths she could have taken. Decisions she could have made. What would she do? In 1896 she joined the Canossian order in Venice and assisted the community for 50 years. Instead of hatred, resentment, or vengeance, St. Josephine said she would thank her captors, for if it had not been for them, she would have never come to know Jesus Christ. That is amazing faith and love for God. St. Josephine Bakhita is the patron saint of Sudan and for human trafficking. As of 2015, her feast day, February 8, is also the international day of prayer against human trafficking.

St. Josephine Bakhita, pray for us!

Lent is a 40 day season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends at sundown on Holy Thursday. It's a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at Easter.

During Lent, we seek the Lord in prayer by reading Sacred Scripture; we serve by giving alms; and we practice self-control through fasting. We are called not only to abstain from luxuries during Lent, but to a true inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully. We recall the waters of baptism in which we were also baptized into Christ's death, died to sin and evil, and began new life in Christ.

Many know of the tradition of abstaining from meat on Fridays during Lent, but we are also called to practice self-discipline and fast in other ways throughout the season. In addition, the giving of alms is one way to share God's gifts—not only through the distribution of money, but through the sharing of our time and talents. As St. John Chrysostom reminds us: *"Not to enable the poor to share in our goods is to steal from them and deprive them of life. The goods we possess are not ours, but theirs."* (Catechism of the Catholic Church, no. 2446).

In Lent, the baptized are called to renew their baptismal commitment as others prepare to be baptized through the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults.

Prayer: *"For me, prayer is a surge of the heart; it is a simple look turned toward heaven, it is a cry of recognition and of love, embracing both trial and joy."* -St. Therese of Lisieux (CCC 2558)

During Lent, we are asked to devote ourselves to seeking the Lord in prayer and reading Scripture, to service by giving alms, and to practice self-control through fasting. Dive into God's word in Scripture this Lent or pray the rosary with your family.

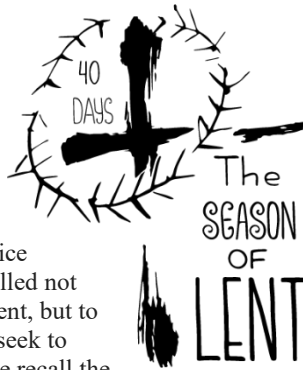
Fasting: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily his Resurrection.

CRS Rice Bowl is also one way Catholics can enhance their Lenten fasting practice by giving up meals and donating the cost of those meals to Catholic Relief Services in order to help those who do not have enough to eat.

Almsgiving: The foundational call of Christians to charity is a frequent theme of the Gospels. During Lent, we are asked to focus more intently on "almsgiving," which means donating money or goods to the poor and performing other acts of charity. As one of the three pillars of Lenten practice, almsgiving is "a witness to fraternal charity" and "a work of justice pleasing to God." (Catechism of the Catholic Church, no. 2462).

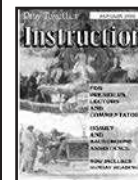
