

Some Ideas for a Good & Holy Lent

Prayer

- Sit in silence for 15 minutes of prayer.
- Pray for someone each day. Assign each day of Lent to pray for a specific person.
- Commit a prayer or a Scripture verse to memory.
- Create a new habit by doing a daily examen each day/evening.
- Stop hitting snooze and give Jesus your first 5 minutes of the day.
- Challenge yourself to a Holy Hour in Adoration each week.

Fasting

- Give up multitasking and be truly present to the person or task in front of you.
- Switch from secular music/books/podcasts to options that will build and increase your friendship with Jesus.
- Fast from looking at your phone for a block of time where your loved ones would benefit from your full attention.
- Give up gossiping. Every time you are tempted to speak about someone else unkindly share a compliment instead.

Almsgiving

- One day a week, eat ONLY 2 bowls of oatmeal, cereal, or rice. Offer it in prayer for those living without food.
- Make a point of saying thank you ten times each day.
- Set aside one item from your pantry each day and donate it to the food pantry. Give of your first fruits instead of your leftovers.
- Introduce yourself to someone new at church.

Sunday's Mass Readings

First Sunday of Lent - 06 March 2022

Deuteronomy 26:4-10. Psalm 91:1-2, 10-11, 12-13, 14-15. Romans 10:8-13. Luke 4:1-13.

Reflecting on Baptism and Temptations. Luke's gospel recounts that Jesus, filled with the Holy Spirit at Jordan's baptism, is led by that same Spirit into the desert – a place for reflection and prayer. And hunger. And temptations by *diabolos*, the false accuser. What happens? Strengthened by baptism at which he is called "beloved", temptations are resisted – not easily, but resisted nonetheless. Food for our thoughtful reflections this Lent.

- How does my Baptism strengthen me for Christian living?
- How can I face temptations of eating, of power, of vain glory this Lent?
- How will I pray for and support the elect throughout the diocese called this day to Baptism-Confirmation-Eucharist at the coming Easter Vigil?

Theological Thoughts with Deacon Michael

At the 10:30 Mass this Sunday, we will celebrate the Rite of Sending with Lisa Marie Dean, our one catechumen (candidate for full initiation at the Easter Vigil - Baptism, Confirmation, and First Holy Communion).

Where are we "sending" her? To the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in Springfield, where Sunday afternoon at 2:30 we will celebrate the Rite of Election. In the Rite of Election, Bishop Paprocki calls the catechumens of the diocese and acknowledges and ratifies the call of Christ in their lives on behalf of the church.

This is an important step on the journey that is the *Rite of Christian* Initiation of Adults (RCIA), the ongoing Rite by which the church welcomes and initiates new adult members. By ongoing, I mean that it is always running – all year every year – always welcoming new members and journeying with them to the Sacraments of Initiation. Pray for and help encourage more catechumens here at St. Elizabeth Parish!

Those of us involved in RCIA are extremely excited for Lisa as she takes this next step in her journey of faith, and for her daughter Meghan (our 3rd grade teacher who came into the church two years ago), and their whole family. Watching the faith continue blossom in their family has been a true blessing. Please join us in prayer for them, and especially Lisa as she encounters these Rites.

Lent is a 40 day season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends at sundown on Holy Thursday. It's a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at Easter.

During Lent, we seek the Lord in prayer by reading Sacred Scripture;

we serve by giving alms; and we practice self-control through fasting. We are called not only to abstain from luxuries during Lent, but to a true inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully. We recall the

waters of baptism in which we were also baptized into Christ's death, died to sin and evil, and began new life in Christ. Many know of the tradition of abstaining from meat on Fridays during Lent, but we are also called to practice self-discipline and fast in other ways throughout the season. In addition, the giving of alms is one way to share God's gifts—not only through the distribution of money, but through the sharing of our time and talents. As St. John Chrysostom reminds us: "Not to enable the poor to share in our goods is to steal from them and deprive them of life. The goods we possess are not ours, but theirs." (Catechism of the Catholic Church, no. 2446).

In Lent, the baptized are called to renew their baptismal commitment as others prepare to be baptized through the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults.

<u>Prayer:</u> "For me, prayer is a surge of the heart; it is a simple look turned toward heaven, it is a cry of recognition and of love, embracing both trial and joy." -St. Therese of Lisieux (CCC 2558)

During Lent, we are asked to devote ourselves to seeking the Lord in prayer and reading Scripture, to service by giving alms, and to practice self-control through fasting. Dive into God's word in Scripture this Lent or pray the rosary with your family.

Fasting: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily his Resurrection.

CRS Rice Bowl is also one way Catholics can enhance their Lenten fasting practice by giving up meals and donating the cost of those meals to Catholic Relief Services in order to help those who do not have enough to eat.

Almsgiving: The foundational call of Christians to charity is a frequent theme of the Gospels. During Lent, we are asked to focus more intently on "almsgiving," which means donating money or goods to the poor and performing other acts of charity. As one of the three pillars of Lenten practice, almsgiving is "a witness to fraternal charity" and "a work of justice pleasing to God." (Catechism of the Catholic Church, no. 2462).
