Saint Joseph, Pray For Us

This coming Saturday, March 19, the Church celebrates a special solemnity: The Solemnity of Saint Joseph, Husband of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This and the Memorial of Saint Joseph the Worker on May 1 are two primary feasts devoted to Saint Joseph in the Church year.

Since this is a Solemnity, though, it is the highest type of celebration in the Church. In fact, at Masses on this day, even though it's in Lent, we would sing the Gloria since it's a Solemnity.

We celebrate Joseph because he was a just and holy man, chosen by God to be the foster father of Jesus. He trusted in God and protected Mary and Jesus by fleeing to Egypt. Little is known of him other than what has been handed down in tradition. He does not speak a single word in the gospels and little is known about him. Since he is not mentioned in Jesus' adult life, it is assumed he died earlier with Mary and Jesus beside him.

Regardless, we celebrate and honor him because of the role he played in the Holy Family, his closeness to Jesus and Mary, and the powerful role he can play as an intercessor for us.

"The greatness of Saint Joseph is that he was the spouse of Mary and the father of Jesus. In this way, he placed himself, in the words of Saint John Chrysostom, 'at the service of the entire plan of salvation.""

One of those present or the leader reads a text of sacred Scripture, for example: Listen to the words of the holy Gospel according to Matthew: 1:18-23: Now this is how the birth of Jesus Christ came about. When his mother Mary was betrothed to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found with child through the holy Spirit. Joseph her husband, since he was a righteous man, yet unwilling to expose her to shame, decided to divorce her quietly. Such was his intention when, behold, the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home. For it is through the holy Spirit that this child has been conceived in her. She will bear a son and you are to name him Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins." All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: "Behold, the virgin shall be with child and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel," which means "God is with us."

The leader says the prayer of blessing with the hands joined:

All-provident God, the good things that grace this table remind us of your many good gifts. Bless this food, and may the prayers of St. Joseph, who provided bread for your Son and food for the poor, sustain us and all our brothers and sisters on our journey towards your heavenly Kingdom. Through Christ our Lord. R/. Amen.

Theological Thoughts with Deacon Michael

The below is adapted & abbreviated from "All Your Questions About Adoration Answered", from catholic-link.org

We encourage a lot of "going to Adoration" in our parish, but maybe you still don't really understand what that means. That's ok! Though the practice of Adoration has been a part of the Catholic faith since the very beginning, it has experienced a revival of sorts among Catholics today.

What is Adoration? When Catholics say they are "going to Adoration," they are typically referring to Eucharistic Adoration, the worship of the Eucharist outside of the Mass. The Eucharistic Host is displayed in a monstrance on the altar so that all can see and pray in the presence of Christ.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church tells us that, "Adoration is the first attitude of man acknowledging that he is a creature before his Creator. It exalts the greatness of the Lord who made us and the almighty power of the Savior who sets us free from evil. Adoration is homage of the spirit to the 'King of Glory,' respectful silence in the presence of the "ever greater" God. Adoration of the thriceholy and sovereign God of love blends with humility and gives assurance to our supplications." (CCC 2628)

We can show our adoration to God in many ways, but in Eucharistic Adoration, we spend time adoring the true presence of Christ in the Eucharist.

What Do I Do During Eucharistic Adoration? As a form of respect, you should always genuflect when you enter and see the Lord in the Host. Maintain an attitude of respect, and if others are present, silence. On retreats or other special occasions, there may be music playing to help foster a spirit of prayer, worship, and Adoration. Always keep in mind that you are in the presence of God! Kneeling, sitting, standing, and even laying on the floor before the Blessed Sacrament are all appropriate forms of prayer. Let your posture reflect your worship of the King and do what is comfortable for you.

You really don't have to "do" anything during Adoration. You can just sit there and look at Jesus. Take the time to be with Him. If you are the only person in the chapel, don't be afraid to pray or sing aloud. This is your personal time with Christ.

When Can I Go to Adoration? Here at St. Elizabeth, we have Adoration on Thursdays from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. and on Sundays (with Vespers) from 7:30-8:30 p.m. Join us!

The Saints Encourage Us to Go to Adoration

"Whenever I go to the chapel, I put myself in the presence of our good Lord, and I say to him, 'Lord, I am here. Tell me what you would have me to do'... And then, I tell God everything that is in my heart. I tell him about my pains and my joys, and then I listen. If you listen, God will also speak to you, for with the good Lord, you have to both speak and listen. God always speaks to you when you approach him plainly and simply." – St. Catherine Labouré

The time you spend with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament is the best time that you will spend on earth. Each moment that you spend with Jesus will deepen your union with Him and make your soul everlastingly more glorious and beautiful in heaven and will help bring about an everlasting peace on earth." – St. Teresa of Calcutta

"Know also that you will probably gain more by praying fifteen minutes before the Blessed Sacrament than by all the other spiritual exercises of the day. True, Our Lord hears our prayers anywhere, for He has made the promise, 'Ask, and you shall receive,' but He has revealed to His servants that those who visit Him in the Blessed Sacrament will obtain a more abundant measure of grace." – St. Alphonsus Liguori


