## Pentecost - Receive the Holy Spirit

From a catechetical instruction by Saint Cyril of Jerusalem, bishop

The water that I shall give him will become in him a fountain of living water, welling up into eternal life. This is a new kind of water, a living, leaping water, welling up for those who are worthy. But why did Christ call the grace of the Spirit water? Because all things are dependent on water; plants and animals have their origin in water. Water comes down from heaven as rain, and although it is always the same in itself, it produces many different effects, one in the palm tree, another in the vine, and so on throughout the whole of creation. It does not come down, now as one thing, now as another, but while remaining essentially the same, it adapts itself to the needs of every creature that receives it.

In the same way the Holy Spirit, whose nature is always the same, simple and indivisible, apportions grace to each man as he wills. Like a dry tree which puts forth shoots when watered, the soul bears the fruit of holiness when repentance has made it worthy of receiving the Holy Spirit. Although the Spirit never changes, the effects of this action,



by the will of God and in the name of Christ, are both many and marvelous. The Spirit makes one man a teacher of divine truth, inspires another to prophesy, gives another the power of casting out devils, enables another to interpret holy Scripture. The Spirit strengthens one man's self-control, shows another how to

help the poor, teaches another to fast and lead a life of asceticism. makes another oblivious to the needs of the body, trains another for martyrdom. His action is different in different people, but the Spirit himself is always the same. In each person, Scripture says, the Spirit reveals his presence in a particular way for the common good.

The Spirit comes gently and makes himself known by his fragrance. He is not felt as a burden, for he is light, very light. Rays of light and knowledge stream before him as he approaches. The Spirit comes with the tenderness of a true friend and protector to save, to heal, to teach, to counsel, to strengthen, to console. The Spirit comes to enlighten the mind first of the one who receives him, and then, through him, the minds of others as well.

As light strikes the eyes of a man who comes out of darkness into the sunshine and enables him to see clearly things he could not discern before, so light floods the soul of the man counted worthy of receiving the Holy Spirit and enables him to see things beyond the range of human vision, things hitherto undreamed of.

## **LEARNING & LIVING AS DISCIPLES**



From our Pastor, Father Alfred Tumwesigye Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Praised be Jesus Christ! Summer season is here,

the most awaited time of the year in the lives of many of us. It is the time of the year when most families get the opportunity to take a break from their daily routine, travel for vacations, or relax and enjoy family time away from the place they call home. It a time to connect with friends and visit new places with the hope of doing something new that is worthwhile and different from the usual regular routine.

We read in Mark 6:30-32, that while the apostles gathered together with Jesus and reported all they had done and taught. He said to them, "'Come away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest a while.' People were coming and going in great numbers, and they had no opportunity even to eat. So, they went off in the boat by themselves to a deserted place".

Now, this is the time of the year that I get to travel for my 5-weeks' vacation to Uganda, not by 'boat cruise' as the apostles did above but by a 35-hour journey with multiple flights departing on Wednesday, June 15, 2022 at 3:27 PM from St. Louis Lambert International Airport to LaGuardia Airport, then transfer to John F. Kennedy International Airport for my international flight to Doha International Airport in Doha, Qatar (Middle East), where I will hop onto my last flight home to Entebbe International Airport in Uganda, arriving on Friday, June 17, 2022, at 7:20 AM East African Time. (NB: Uganda is 8 hours ahead during summer time setting). Then I will be picked by Msgr. Severinus's driver for 4 hours 25 min (166 miles/266.8 km) drive to the archbishop's house (Nyamitanga - Mbarara Archdiocese for a rest.

The next day, Saturday, June 18, 2022, I will drive (thanks to Msgr. Severinus, who allowed me to use his car while he is here) for 1 hour 33 min (43.9 miles) to the hilly, rocky destination I call home, visit with my family, and celebrate the Holy Sacrifice of Mass with our local community at St. Augustine Catholic Church mission station on the Father's

Day, Sunday, June 19, 2022.

I have been asked several times, what will you be doing in your vacation time? The truth is that I have nothing planned - there is no to do list of things, apart from the last week, before the return journey on July 25, when I will do my annual priest's retreat at Namugongo, Uganda Martyrs Shrine. However, this my best time of the year as it gives me a chance to relax and connect with my Ugandan extended family, childhood friends, my brother priests - while getting to meet the new priests and deacons that were ordained last year, and those preparing to be ordained this year. I look forward to this incredible time for me to visit with my 14 nephews, and 12 nieces (of whom one nephew and one niece were born in the spring of 2022).

What I am sure of is the visits to my grandparents' place, harvesting coffee beans, preparing delicious and mouth-watering local dishes and relishing every bite of the food, in the evenings sitting with my dad, and listening to his stories, at night time gazing at the stars and listening to the sound of crickets, and frogs for the nearest swamp that will carry me back in time to the priceless moments of my childhood memories of a caring and loving extended family in the village with no sound of cars at night. Other than that, the cool thing is that I am getting rest time, which allows me trust in God and allow God to work; not only in my life, but also among you whom I leave behind, while I become attentive to Psalm 46:11: "Be still and know that I am God!", and let God be exalted among all of us.

While I am gone, our diocese has allowed two priests to be at St. Elizabeth Parish, while residing in the Parish Rectory to share with you the gift of faith, while celebrating the sacraments.



This weekend meet REV. DR. MSGR. SEVERINUS NDUGWA who will be with you from June that 13, when he arrives to June 26th. Born in July 1968 in Rwampara Dis-

trict, southwestern Uganda. His parents are Lazarus and Helena Mwangutsya (both deceased). He is a 5th child of 6 children: 2 boys and 4 girls.

He Studied from Kaiho Mixed School (primary), Kitabi Minor Seminary (secondary), St. Thomas Aquinas Katigondo Major Seminary (philosophy), St. Paul's Kinyamasika National Seminary (theology). He was Ordained a priest on 26th July 1997 for the Archdiocese of Mbarara.

He taught at Kitabi Seminary, worked briefly in a parish, Head teacher at St. Joseph's Vocational School, worked in Archbishop's Office as Assistant Chancellor and Diocesan Projects Coordinator. Since October 2020 Rev. Dr. Severinus is the Vicar General of the Archdiocese of Mbarara.

He had further studies at Makerere University Uganda (Postgraduate Diploma in Education), University of the Holy Cross Rome (MA in Sacred Liturgy), and Pontifical University of Ireland in Dublin (PhD in Liturgical Theology).

His hobbies are reading, making friends, touring, and discovering new places, cultures and counseling young people and listening to the vulnerable of society (elderly, sick, refugees, orphans, etcetera).

Then, in the weekend bulletin of June 25/26, you will get to meet REV. FR. YOHANA SHIJA MASALU, who will be with you from June 27th when he arrives to July 28, 2022.

May the Lord God who is good all the time keep us united in prayers, and for those of us traveling for vacation time, may He grant us journey mercies to and from. Amen.

#### **SACRAMENTS**

**Reconciliation:** If you have been away from the Church and the Sacrament of Reconciliation for a while, feel free to contact the parish office for guidance & materials to help you prepare to return to the Sacraments. In addition to Confessions offered from 3-4 p.m. on Saturdays, you could also schedule an individual time for Reconciliation.

Anointing of the Sick: Anointing of the Sick is appropriate for any upcoming surgery, prolonged illness, or in the event of emergency or danger of death. Please call the office if you or a loved one needs to be anointed.

Infant & Child Baptism: For children under the age of 8, please submit the forms at stelizabethgc.org/baptism and sign up for a Baptism Preparation class at least a month before your desired date of Baptism. For questions or emergencies, please contact the Parish Office or Deacon Michael. Baptisms are usually celebrated after the 10:30 Mass most Sundays or at 7 p.m. some Wednesdays.

Matrimony: To begin preparation for Holy Matrimony, please contact Father Alfred or Deacon Michael at least six months (recommended twelve months) before your desired date. At least an introductory interview must be completed before a date can be set.

Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, first Holy Communion) for children 8 and over, or for adults: Contact Deacon Michael via the Parish Office.

### PASTORAL CARE

Entering the Church: If you are new to the Catholic faith and interested in learning more about the church or about entering the church, welcome! Contact the parish office for a meeting with Father Alfred or Deacon Michael.

Communion to the Homebound: If you or a family member are, or are going to be, homebound, whether at home or in a care facility, please notify the parish office. Medical and care facilities are unable to inform us of their Catholic residents and patients. We would be happy to arrange to visit and bring you Holy Communion. Please contact the parish office for arrangements.

Declarations of Nullity: In some cases, a man or a woman desires healing through a declaration by a Church tribunal (a Catholic Church court), which does not deny that a relationship existed, but simply states that the relationship was missing something that the Church requires for a valid marriage, falling short of at least one of the essential elements required for a binding union. (Commonly called an 'annulment.') Father Alfred, Deacon Michael, and Laura Black are available as Advocates before our diocesan tribunal for those needing assistance with declarations of nullity. Call the parish office to set up an appointment.
