LEARNING & LIVING AS DISCIPLES

A Prayer for our Country

Archbishop Carroll wrote the following prayer for our newly formed government on November 10, 1791, to be recited in parishes throughout his diocese. The text of the prayer below is taken from the National Catholic Register.

We pray, O almighty and eternal God, who through Jesus Christ has revealed thy glory to all nations, to preserve the works of your mercy, that your Church, being spread through the whole world, may continue with unchanging faith in the confession of your name.

We pray Thee, who alone are good and holy, to endow with heavenly knowledge, sincere zeal and sanctity of life, our chief bishop, the pope, the vicar of Our Lord Jesus Christ, in the government of his Church; our own bishop, all other bishops, prelates and pastors of the Church; and especially those who are appointed to exercise among us the functions of the holy ministry, and conduct your people into the ways of salvation.

We pray O God of might, wisdom and justice, through whom authority is rightly administered, laws are enacted, and judgment decreed, assist with your Holy Spirit of counsel and fortitude the president of these United States, that his administration may be conducted in righteousness and be eminently useful to your people over whom he presides; by encouraging due respect for virtue and religion; by a faithful execution of the laws in justice and mercy; and by restraining vice and immorality.

Let the light of your divine wisdom direct the deliberations of Congress, and shine forth in all the proceedings and laws framed for our rule and government, so that they may tend to the preservation of peace, the promotion of national happiness, the increase of industry, sobriety and useful knowledge; and may perpetuate to us the blessing of equal liberty.

We pray for his excellency, the governor of this state, for the members of the assembly, for all judges, magistrates, and other officers who are appointed to guard our political welfare, that they may be enabled, by your powerful protection, to discharge the duties of their respective stations with honesty and ability.

We recommend likewise, to your unbounded mercy, all our brethren and fellow citizens throughout the United States, that they may be blessed in the knowledge and sanctified in the observance of your most holy law; that they may be preserved in union, and in that peace which the world cannot give; and after enjoying the blessings of this life, be admitted to those which are eternal.

Finally, we pray to you, O Lord of mercy, to remember the souls of your servants departed, who are gone before us with the sign of faith and repose in the sleep of peace; the souls of our parents, relatives and friends; of those who, when living, were members of this congregation, and particularly of such as are lately deceased; of all benefactors who, by their donations or legacies to this Church, witnessed their zeal for the decency of divine worship and proved their claim to our grateful and charitable remembrance. To these, O Lord, and to all that rest in Christ, grant, we beseech you, a place of refreshment, light and everlasting peace, through the same Jesus Christ, Our Lord and Savior. Amen.

He was ordained as a priest on October 4, 2018 at Kawekamo Mwanza. After ordination, he worked as an assistant pastor at All the Saints Parish Kiloleli Mwanza (5 months), and the pastor of St. John the Apostle parish Nyang'wilolelwa Mwanza (2 years).

Currently, he is studying at Duquesne University in Pennsylvania, majoring in Finance and Economics. Lastly, as means of communication, he speaks Sukuma, Swahili, Italian, English, and Spanish languages, and reads German and French languages.

A Note about This Year's Mission Appeal

Dear Fr. Alfred & Parishioners,

Greetings from Ghana and from STYDEC(St. Therese Youth Development and Education Center). Thank you so much for giving us the opportunity to share our story and ministry with you through this year's Mission Appeal. As the date draws closer, I am

pleased to inform you that, Fr. Matthias Mornah will be your missionary priest.

He will be speaking on behalf of the Missionary Society of St. Theresa of the Little Flower also known as the Theresian Fathers, a religious community of priests and brothers in the Diocese of Wa in Ghana. The apostolate of the Theresian Fathers is Evangelization and Education in the most rural parts of Ghana. Rural, meaning, they have no clean drinking water and no electricity. Children have to walk several miles each day to school in a nearby town and back and usually do so, many a time, on empty stomach. We find it our calling to reach out and journey with such children and provide for their human and spiritual needs in whatever ways we can.

One of our Ministries is the St. Therese Youth Center which we are focusing on this year for our Mission Appeal. There are two main projects for the course of this Mission Appeal; one is to drill 4 wells in 4 communities to provide clean drinking water for the

children and their families. The second one is to provide one nutritious meal a day for the over 120 kids we work with in an after school program in northern Ghana. It costs \$7,000 to construct one well and a budget of \$25,000/yr to feed the children. All funds from this Mission Co-op in your parish will go directly to these two causes. In order to realize these goals, we count on your generosity.

SACRAMENTS

Reconciliation: If you have been away from the Church and the Sacrament of Reconciliation for a while, feel free to contact the parish office for guidance & materials to help you prepare to return to the Sacraments. In addition to Confessions offered from 3-4 p.m. on Saturdays, you could also schedule an individual time for Reconciliation.

Anointing of the Sick: Anointing of the Sick is appropriate for any upcoming surgery, prolonged illness, or in the event of emergency or danger of death. Please call the office if you or a loved one needs to be anointed.

Infant & Child Baptism: For children under the age of 8, please submit the forms at stelizabethgc.org/baptism and sign up for a Baptism Preparation class at least a month before your desired date of Baptism. For questions or emergencies, please contact the Parish Office or Deacon Michael. Baptisms are usually celebrated after the 10:30 Mass most Sundays or at 7 p.m. some Wednesdays.

Matrimony: To begin preparation for Holy Matrimony, please contact Father Alfred or Deacon Michael at least six months (recommended twelve months) before your desired date. At least an introductory interview must be completed before a date can be set.

Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, first Holy Communion) for children 8 and over, or for adults: Contact Deacon Michael via the Parish Office.

PASTORAL CARE

Entering the Church: If you are new to the Catholic faith and interested in learning more about the church or about entering the church, welcome! Contact the parish office for a meeting with Father Alfred or Deacon Michael.

Communion to the Homebound: If you or a family member are, or are going to be, homebound, whether at home or in a care facility, please notify the parish office. Medical and care facilities are unable to inform us of their Catholic residents and patients. We would be happy to arrange to visit and bring you Holy Communion. Please contact the parish office for arrangements.

Declarations of Nullity: In some cases, a man or a woman desires healing through a declaration by a Church tribunal (a Catholic Church court), which does not deny that a relationship existed, but simply states that the relationship was missing something that the Church requires for a valid marriage, falling short of at least one of the essential elements required for a binding union. (Commonly called an 'annulment.') Father Alfred, Deacon Michael, and Laura Black are available as Advocates before our diocesan tribunal for those needing assistance with declarations of nullity. Call the parish office to set up an appointment.
