

Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time ♦ August 21, 2022



Father Henry Schmidt, 90, of Carrollton, passed away August 11, 2022 at Jerseyville Manor. He was born September 24, 1931 in Carrollton, and was raised by his father and mother, Henry and Anna (Meyer) Schmidt, along with his five brothers, Fred, Joe, John, Charlie and Bob, and his sister, Henrianne, on a farm in rural Carrollton.

He worked the farm until his graduation from St. Johns Catholic High School in 1949. He then entered the seminary and was ordained a priest in 1957. He served in that capacity for 65 years in many parishes in the Springfield Dioceses, including as pastor of St. Elizabeth in Granite City from 1977-1987. In July of 2002, he was assigned to his hometown parish St. Johns the Evangelist Church in Carrollton, along with St. Michaels Parish in Greenfield and All Saints Parish in White Hall.

Fr. Henry loved to interact with his family and his 23 nieces and nephews. He worked very hard in many youth activities in addition to his parish duties by incorporating the beauty of the outdoors. Fr. Henry was an accomplished writer and published a book, "The Pastor's Sandal Path", in which many of his sermons and life experiences were shared for all to read. Fr. Henry is survived by his brother, John Schmidt and his sister, Sister Henrianne Schmidt. He is also survived by numerous nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by his parents, four brothers, Fred, Joseph, Charles and Bob Schmidt. A funeral Mass was celebrated Wednesday at St. Johns Catholic Church in Carrollton, with burial in St. Johns Cemetery.





Cathy Pabst recalls, "Fr. Schmidt was a very spiritual, holy man. I used to watch him pray his Office in the small chapel of the old church before Mass.Nothing showy, just simple, quiet prayer that spoke volumes of his faith. It always touched my heart."

Two memories shared by the Loftus family include, "Father Schmidt would walk to our house every year on the first snow of the year. He always wore sandals and showed up knocking on the door. We would invite him in but he wouldn't want to come in and miss the new snow! We also remember Father getting to ride in a hot air balloon. We can't remember exactly why we had this event but he was so excited. He was like a little kid that got the best present ever. He always had a smile on his face but it was even bigger that day."

The Groboskis write, "Fr Schmidt was the originator of our church family picnic. The first picnic was simply that all families brought their own food! The picnic just kept building each year until it became what it is today. We can still picture Fr Schmidt on the tractor in his jean shorts mowing the grass around the property no matter how hot it was!"

Tom Layloff shares, "I fondly remember Fr. Schmidt's leadership in re-establishing the picnic. He also conducted my instruction in becoming a Catholic."


Steve Hay shares this memory: "When Mary would play guitar for the various religious ceremonies, Fr. Schmidt would always rescue me at the receptions afterwards and play "Greed" (dice game) to keep me entertained. Although Fr. Schmidt always seemed to enjoy it as much as I did! He always carried them in his shirt pocket!"

And Mary Hay recalls, "We met with Fr. Schmidt for our Pre-Cana test results on a beauti-

ful spring evening. There was a generous amount of tension between our families and surrounding our wedding and he spoke with us about that. Our wedding day was a couple months away but he offered that night to marry us, right then and there. It was so peaceful and there was a gentle breeze blowing the curtains and at that moment we both had a reprieve from everything that had been going on. As we sat there and pondered we were both so tempted, but I realized my mother would've never forgiven me! What a sweet memory of that special night and the gentleness of his spirit... When we moved into our apartment after we were first married, Fr. Schmidt came over one morning. He visited with us for a while and he taught us that day what a mourning dove was and what it sounded like. The mourning dove has since been my favorite bird because of its peaceful nature, much like Fr. Schmidt."

Jackie Jones recalls that "Fr. Schmidt married Dennis and me on April 23, 1982, 40 years ago."

"Fr. Schmidt will always live in our hearts. Rest well good and faithful servant." -Cathy Pabst

You can also done small packs of baby wipes, purse-size tissue packs, toilet paper, ChapStick, any travel size toiletries, new combs, gently used or new bath washcloths. We take these items to the monthly outreach on the open lot at Community Care so they can be freely given to those who need a helping hand. SACRAMENTS

Reconciliation: If you have been away from the Church and the Sacrament of Reconciliation for a while, feel free to contact the parish office for guidance & materials to help you prepare to return to the Sacraments. In addition to Confessions offered from 3-4 p.m. on Saturdays, you could also schedule an individual time for Reconciliation.

Anointing of the Sick: Anointing of the Sick is appropriate for any upcoming surgery, prolonged illness, or in the event of emergency or danger of death. Please call the office if you or a loved one needs to be anointed.

Infant & Child Baptism: For children under the age of 8, please submit the forms at stelizabethgc.org/baptism and sign up for a Baptism Preparation class at least a month before your desired date of Baptism. For questions or emergencies, please contact the Parish Office or Deacon Michael. Baptisms are usually celebrated after the 10:30 Mass most Sundays or at 7 p.m. some Wednesdays.

Matrimony: To begin preparation for Holy Matrimony, please contact Father Alfred or Deacon Michael at least six months (recommended twelve months) before your desired date. At least an introductory interview must be completed before a date can be set.

Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, first Holy Communion) for children 8 and over, or for adults: Contact Deacon Michael via the Parish Office.

PASTORAL CARE

Entering the Church: If you are new to the Catholic faith and interested in learning more about the church or about entering the church, welcome! Contact the parish office for a meeting with Father Alfred or Deacon Michael.

Communion to the Homebound: If you or a family member are, or are going to be, homebound, whether at home or in a care facility, please notify the parish office. Medical and care facilities are unable to inform us of their Catholic residents and patients. We would be happy to arrange to visit and bring you Holy Communion. Please contact the parish office for arrangements.

Declarations of Nullity: In some cases, a man or a woman desires healing through a declaration by a Church tribunal (a Catholic Church court), which does not deny that a relationship existed, but simply states that the relationship was missing something that the Church requires for a valid marriage, falling short of at least one of the essential elements required for a binding union. (Commonly called an 'annulment.') Father Alfred, Deacon Michael, and Laura Black are available as Advocates before our diocesan tribunal for those needing assistance with declarations of nullity. Call the parish office to set up an appointment.
