Journeying to the Easter Sacraments

The Rites of Sending & Election, and the Journey of our Catechumen

From the early generations of the church, the period leading up to Easter, which we now know as the 40 days of Lent, was a time for the faithful to journey alongside the catechumens, those undergoing the final days of their journey to the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, and first Holy Communion) at the Easter Vigil.

The original idea of the penitential & liturgical season of Lent comes from this journeying together with the catechumens.

This year, God has blessed our parish with one catechumen, Katie Kukarola, Katie started attending Mass faithfully with her now-husband about a year before their wedding. She shares that being at Mass gives her a sense of peace and comfort, and she felt so welcomed and supported by people she didn't even know through their engagement and the start of their marriage. She has been with us learning more about our faith since the start of the Rescue

Project late last summer. Katie's sponsor for the Sacraments is Marilyn Baumann, who has been a friend and coworker of Katie's.

At the start of this final Lenten journey to the Easter Sacraments, the catechumen is first sent forth from our parish in a "Rite of Sending" and sent to a "Rite of Election" at our diocesan Cathedral. The Rite of Sending gives us as a parish the opportunity to acknowledge our Lord's call of our catechumen

> and to pray for her as she is sent to the Cathedral. At the Rite of Election (this Sunday at 2:30), Bishop Paprocki will acknowledge and ratify our Lord's call of Katie.

In this context, "election" comes from the word's Latin roots, meaning being chosen. After the Rite of Election, the catechumen becomes the *Elect* - someone chosen for the Easter Sacraments. We will continue to journey with Katie continued on page 3

"Journeying Towards the Easter Sacraments", continued from page 1: through the Scrutinies at Masses on the 3rd, 4th, and 5th Sundays of Lent as we approach Easter together.

This is not a journey to be taken lightly! Cardinal Jean Daniélou wrote of the conflict between catechumens and Satan, their enemy: "The catechumen's forty days of Lent are a time of trial, a time of serious conflict, while Satan and his angels strive to keep possession of [her] soul. This is no figure of speech, but must be understood in literal reality: for a pagan is not merely ignorant of the Christian revelation, [she] is subject to the active domination of the powers of darkness, and needs to be wrested out of captivity. ... Even after Christ's victory, the human nature of those who are not his remains imprisoned: he crushed the serpent's head, but its coils are writhing yet to ensnare the peoples of the earth. Satan, seeing his prey about to escape, redoubles his efforts against the catechumen; but during the forty days, Christ's hold is strengthened too. ...but the devil keeps up his pressure all the while until the very moment of the Easter Vigil and the very edge of the font.

Then, and only then, the impossible thing comes to pass; the sea is divided. As the waters were opened for the Israelites, and the gates of death were opened for the Lord Jesus, even so, the catechumen goes down into the water of baptism, makes [her] crossing, leaves behind [her] Pharaoh and his host, the devil and his angels, and comes out on the other side. [She] is saved. Saved, that is, quite literally, like a shipwrecked survivor brought to land.

Let us continue to pray & fast for our catechumen ("Elect" after this Sunday, God-willing) as we approach Easter through Lent together.

Preparing to pray the Divine Mercy Novena

From Good Friday through Divine Mercy Sunday, we pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet each day of the Novena. To help prepare, we are sharing the intentions of each day of the Novena, one per week, in these weeks leading up to Good Friday. On Palm Sunday we will print the full Novena.


Fifth Day: Today bring to Me THE SOULS
OF THOSE WHO HAVE SEPARATED THEMSELVES FROM
MY CHURCH,* and immerse them in the ocean of My
mercy. During My bitter Passion they tore at My Body and
Heart, that is, My Church. As they return to unity with the
Church, My wounds heal and in this way they alleviate My
Passion.

Most Merciful Jesus, Goodness Itself, You do not refuse light to those who seek it of You. Receive into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart the souls of those who have separated themselves from Your Church. Draw them by Your light into the unity of the Church, and do not let them escape from the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart; but bring it about that they, too, come to glorify the generosity of Your mercy.

Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon the souls of those who have separated themselves from Your Son's Church, who have squandered Your blessings and misused Your graces by obstinately persisting in their errors. Do not look upon their errors, but upon the love of Your own Son and upon His bitter Passion, which He underwent for their sake, since they, too, are enclosed in His Most Compassionate Heart. Bring it about that they also may glorify Your great mercy for endless ages. Amen.

SACRAMENTS

Reconciliation: If you have been away from the Church and the Sacrament of Reconciliation for a while, feel free to contact the parish office for guidance & materials to help you prepare to return to the Sacraments. In addition to Confessions offered from 3-4 p.m. on Saturdays, you could also schedule an individual time for Reconciliation.

Anointing of the Sick: Anointing of the Sick is appropriate for any upcoming surgery, prolonged illness, or in the event of emergency or danger of death. Please call the office if you or a loved one needs to be anointed.

Infant & Child Baptism: For children under the age of 8, please submit the forms at stelizabethgc.org/baptism and sign up for a Baptism Preparation class at least a month before your desired date of Baptism. For questions or emergencies, please contact the Parish Office or Deacon Michael. Baptisms are usually celebrated after the 10:30 Mass most Sundays or at 7 p.m. some Wednesdays.

Matrimony: To begin preparation for Holy Matrimony, please contact Father Alfred or Deacon Michael at least six months (recommended twelve months) before your desired date. At least an introductory interview must be completed before a date can be set.

Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, first Holy Communion) for children 8 and over, or for adults: Contact Deacon Michael via the Parish Office.

PASTORAL CARE

Entering the Church: If you are new to the Catholic faith and interested in learning more about the church or about entering the church, welcome! Contact the parish office for a meeting with Father Alfred or Deacon Michael.

Communion to the Homebound: If you or a family member are, or are going to be, homebound, whether at home or in a care facility, please notify the parish office. Medical and care facilities are unable to inform us of their Catholic residents and patients. We would be happy to arrange to visit and bring you Holy Communion. Please contact the parish office for arrangements.

Declarations of Nullity: In some cases, a man or a woman desires healing through a declaration by a Church tribunal (a Catholic Church court), which does not deny that a relationship existed, but simply states that the relationship was missing something that the Church requires for a valid marriage, falling short of at least one of the essential elements required for a binding union. (Commonly called an 'annulment.') Father Alfred, Deacon Michael, and Laura Black are available as Advocates before our diocesan tribunal for those needing assistance with declarations of nullity. Call the parish office to set up an appointment.
