


PARISH PICNIC UPDATE

Dear School Families & Parishioners:

Sending out this communication to be as transparent with our efforts for the picnic as we can.

To officially report on last year, we were able to generate around \$80,000. This is good but it could have been better. After evaluating our efforts, there were some opportunities (lessons learned) that we are trying to put into place for this year's planning to help us realize more profits.

We also had to deal with some rain (as usual) on Friday. However, Sunday was dry but temps were over 100 during the day and made for a miserable experience. These two weather factors had an impact to the overall ending dollar amount as well.

Now, for 2023. We are making some changes to the overall schedule of operation. The primary goal is to have more resources to tear down the picnic. For years, we have been doing this tear down on Monday morning and we consistently watch as the number of available people to help with this needed effort continues to decline year after year. As the "regulars" continue to age, the strain and stress on these same individuals has become too much. That is why we will be closing EARLY on Sunday. We will close at 6:00. HOWEVER, we will still staff all of the booths until our normal close time of 10:30. With making sure each of the booths are staffed, this will allow us to organize teams to work on tearing down various parts of the campus....with the goal to have just about everything done and loaded in the barn that night! We will still have the carnival and we will have bands on Friday and Saturday night. We will still have the cabbage rolls and a chicken dinner.

- School families will be required to work 12 hours at the picnic. Each chairperson will be tracking and submitting hours to Loretta Joyce for accurate accounting.
- We still need parishioners to be able to donate their time as well. The picnic is a parish function, not a school function. We cannot be successful without all of you!
- Always looking for donated items for various booths at the picnic (I Dood It, Dime Pitch, Kid's Games, and Silent Auction). There are various areas to drop these items off or contact the chairperson for them to pick up. If you can donate Cardinal Tickets/memorabilia or hockey tickets/memorabilia, vacation packages at your time share, Golf outings, art work.....we will accept your generosity.
- Handicapped parking will be in the preschool parking lot and grass around the lot, behind the PLC, and behind the school on the asphalt. You must have a handicapped plate or sticker on your vehicle for parking.
- There will be NO parking in front of the property on Johnson Road. Police will have signs posted.

Preparing to pray the Divine Mercy Novena

From Good Friday through Divine Mercy Sunday, we pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet each day of the Novena. To prepare, we are sharing the intentions of each day of the Novena in these weeks leading up to Good Friday.



Seventh Day: Today bring to Me THE SOULS WHO ESPECIALLY VENERATE AND GLORIFY MY MERCY,* and immerse them in My mercy. These souls sorrowed most over my Passion and entered most deeply into My spirit. They are living images of My Compassionate Heart. These souls will shine with a special brightness in the next life. Not one of them will go into the fire of hell. I shall particularly defend each one of them at the hour of death. Most Merciful Jesus, whose Heart is Love Itself, receive into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart the souls of those who particularly extol and venerate the greatness of Your mercy. These souls are mighty with the very power of God Himself. In the midst of all afflictions and adversities they go forward, confident of Your mercy; and united to You, O Jesus, they carry all mankind on their shoulders. These souls will not be judged severely, but Your mercy will embrace them as they depart from this life.

Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon the souls who glorify and venerate Your greatest attribute, that of Your fathomless mercy, and who are enclosed in the Most Compassionate Heart of Jesus. These souls are a living Gospel; their hands are full of deeds of mercy, and their hearts, overflowing with joy, sing a canticle of mercy to You, O Most High! I beg You O God: Show them Your mercy according to the hope and trust they have placed in You. SACRAMENTS

Reconciliation: If you have been away from the Church and the Sacrament of Reconciliation for a while, feel free to contact the parish office for guidance & materials to help you prepare to return to the Sacraments. In addition to Confessions offered from 3-4 p.m. on Saturdays, you could also schedule an individual time for Reconciliation.

Anointing of the Sick: Anointing of the Sick is appropriate for any upcoming surgery, prolonged illness, or in the event of emergency or danger of death. Please call the office if you or a loved one needs to be anointed.

Infant & Child Baptism: For children under the age of 8, please submit the forms at stelizabethgc.org/baptism and sign up for a Baptism Preparation class at least a month before your desired date of Baptism. For questions or emergencies, please contact the Parish Office or Deacon Michael. Baptisms are usually celebrated after the 10:30 Mass most Sundays or at 7 p.m. some Wednesdays.

Matrimony: To begin preparation for Holy Matrimony, please contact Father Alfred or Deacon Michael at least six months (recommended twelve months) before your desired date. At least an introductory interview must be completed before a date can be set.

Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, first Holy Communion) for children 8 and over, or for adults: Contact Deacon Michael via the Parish Office.

PASTORAL CARE

Entering the Church: If you are new to the Catholic faith and interested in learning more about the church or about entering the church, welcome! Contact the parish office for a meeting with Father Alfred or Deacon Michael.

Communion to the Homebound: If you or a family member are, or are going to be, homebound, whether at home or in a care facility, please notify the parish office. Medical and care facilities are unable to inform us of their Catholic residents and patients. We would be happy to arrange to visit and bring you Holy Communion. Please contact the parish office for arrangements.

Declarations of Nullity: In some cases, a man or a woman desires healing through a declaration by a Church tribunal (a Catholic Church court), which does not deny that a relationship existed, but simply states that the relationship was missing something that the Church requires for a valid marriage, falling short of at least one of the essential elements required for a binding union. (Commonly called an 'annulment.') Father Alfred, Deacon Michael, and Laura Black are available as Advocates before our diocesan tribunal for those needing assistance with declarations of nullity. Call the parish office to set up an appointment.
