Pope Francis' Prayer Intention for May: For ecclesial movements and groups: We pray that that ecclesial movements and groups might daily rediscover their evangelizing mission.

This Sunday: Sixth Sunday of Easter Acts 8:5-8, 14-17; 1 Peter 4:13-16; John 17:1-11a Philip goes to Samaria, proclaiming Jesus and working signs. Peter and John go there to lay hands on the newly baptized. Saint Peter counsels those who face persecution that they will be glorified by God. In the Gospel, Jesus prays to the Father as his hour has come. He describes how everything he has done has been for the Father.

Next Sunday: Solemnity of the Ascension Acts 1:1-11; Ephesians 1:17-23; Matthew 28:16-20 In the opening verses of Acts, Saint Luke describes how Jesus ascended to the Father, having first entrusted his Apostles with the task of spreading the Gospel throughout the whole world. In the second reading, Paul prays that all who hear his words might experience the wisdom and power of the ascended Christ, who now reigns in glory over all creation. Matthew recalls the ascension of Jesus and his promise to be with them to the end of the age.

14 DAY SANCTUARY LAMP

Black Madonna Shrine & Grottos

The Black Madonna Shrine and Grottos is located in rural Jefferson County, Missouri, about 35 highway miles or 45 minutes southwest of downtown Saint Louis.

The shrine is operated by the Franciscan Missionary Brothers of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. The brothers follow the Rule of Third Order Regular of

Saint Francis; they are a lay and not a clerical or monastic order.

Featured is the altar in the open-air "Chapel of the Hills." Behind the altar is a copy of the famous Our Lady of Czestochowa painting, also known as the "Black Madonna." According to ancient legend, Mary sat for this portrait by Saint Luke the Evangelist at the request of the faithful.

National Shrine of Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal

The National Shrine of Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal is 80 miles south of St. Louis, Missouri, on Interstate 55, near Perryville. Saint Mary's of the Barrens was founded in 1818 by the Vincentian fathers. The Shrine was built in 1929 by the Promoters of the Association of the Miraculous Medal. Visitors





SACRAMENTS

Reconciliation: If you have been away from the Church and the Sacrament of Reconciliation for a while, feel free to contact the parish office for guidance & materials to help you prepare to return to the Sacraments. In addition to Confessions offered from 3-4 p.m. on Saturdays, you could also schedule an individual time for Reconciliation.

Anointing of the Sick: Anointing of the Sick is appropriate for any upcoming surgery, prolonged illness, or in the event of emergency or danger of death. Please call the office if you or a loved one needs to be anointed.

Infant & Child Baptism: For children under the age of 8, please submit the forms at stelizabethgc.org/baptism and sign up for a Baptism Preparation class at least a month before your desired date of Baptism. For questions or emergencies, please contact the Parish Office. Baptisms are usually celebrated after the 10:30 Mass most Sundays or at 7 p.m. some Wednesdays.

Matrimony: To begin preparation for Holy Matrimony, please contact the parish office to set up initial appointments and preparation at least six months (recommended twelve months) before your desired date. At least an introductory interview must be completed before a date can be set.

Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, first Holy Communion) for children 8 and over, or for adults: Contact the parish office.

PASTORAL CARE

Entering the Church: If you are new to the Catholic faith and interested in learning more about the church or about entering the church, welcome! Contact the parish office for a meeting with Father Alfred or Deacon Michael.

Communion to the Homebound: If you or a family member are, or are going to be, homebound, whether at home or in a care facility, please notify the parish office. Declarations of Nullity: In some cases, a man or a woman desires healing through a declaration by a Church tribunal (a Catholic Church court), which does not deny that a relationship existed, but simply states that the relationship was missing something that the Church requires for a valid marriage, falling short of at least one of the essential elements required for a binding union. (Commonly called an 'annulment.') Father Alfred, Deacon Michael, and Laura Black are available as Advocates before our diocesan tribunal for those needing assistance with declarations of nullity.
