The Ascension of the Lord

The Ascension commemoriates when Jesus ascended into heaven at the end of his time on earth.

On the third day after his death and burial, Jesus Christ rose from the dead, an event we call the Resurrection. He spent the next 40 days preaching and preparing His disciples to perform the work of preaching and baptizing all people. At the end of this 40 day period, Jesus ascended into heaven. We call this the Ascension.

By His death and Resurrection, Jesus opened the gates of heaven for all hu-

manity. His Ascension demonstrates this to us. It is His proof that those of us who believe in Him in faith and follow Him will also be raised on the last day, and enter into heaven.

From heaven, Jesus hears our prayers and intercedes for us with His Father.

Article 6 of the Catechism of the Catholic Church is titled, "He ascended nito Heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father." This week, try to find time to read paragraphs 659-667 of the Catechism, which speak of the Ascension.

Our Lady Help of Christians & the Day of Prayer for the Church in China

The celebration of Our Lady Help of Christians on May 24 traces back to 1571. when the whole of Christendom was saved when Catholics throughout Europe prayed the Rosary through the great Battle of Lepanto. The battle occured on October 7, now the Feast of the Holy Rosary, but the celebration of Our Lady Help of Christians on May 24 also started during that time.

In 2007, then-Pope Benedict XVI asked the Church to pray every May 24 for the Church in China. The wish of Benedict XVI was to promote unity in a community that had become divided into "official" and " underground," but at the same time. to foster communion between the entire Catholic Church and Chinese Catholics. Therefore, on this day, all Catholics are called to express their solidarity with Christians in China.

The prayer aims at strengthening Catholics in their faith, especially when public witness and practice of faith or even the explicit proclamation of the Gospel are increasingly restricted by the Chinese communist government.

Pope Francis' Prayer Intention for May: For ecclesial movements and groups: We pray that that ecclesial movements and groups might daily rediscover their evangelizing mission.

This Sunday: Solemnity of the Ascension Acts 1:1-11; Ephesians 1:17-23; Matthew 28:16-20 Luke describes how Jesus ascended to the Father, having first entrusted his Apostles with the task of spreading the Gospel throughout the whole world. In the second reading, Paul prays that all who hear his words might experience the wisdom and power of the ascended Christ, who now reigns in glory over all creation. Matthew recalls the ascension of Jesus and his promise to be with them to the end of the age.

Next Sunday: Pentecost Sunday

Acts 2:1-11; 1 Corinth. 12:3b-7, 12-13; John 20:19-23 We hear about the descent of the Holy Spirit and the first followers of Jesus who began speaking in different tongues. Saint Paul writes of different kinds of spiritual gifts and forms of service, but the same Spirit and Lord who produces all of them in everyone. In the Gospel, Jesus appears to the disciples, saying peace be with you and showing them his hands and his side.

This donation allows the names to be printed constantly in our bulletin, in the exact same way other bulletin ads are funded, and all funds go to offset the cost of printing our bulletin. This is not a donation for a Mass intention since the money does not, and by Canon Law cannot, go into the Mass stipend account, as taking any money for large, so-called "collective intentions" (where multiple names are listed for the Mass intention) is explicitly forbidden. Father is happy to remember these names collectively once a month at Mass with no stipend involved. Your donation is a publishing/printing fee, ultimately paid to our printer in Godfrey, Illinois.

SACRAMENTS

Reconciliation: If you have been away from the Church and the Sacrament of Reconciliation for a while, feel free to contact the parish office for guidance & materials to help you prepare to return to the Sacraments. In addition to Confessions offered from 3-4 p.m. on Saturdays, you could also schedule an individual time for Reconciliation.

Anointing of the Sick: Anointing of the Sick is appropriate for any upcoming surgery, prolonged illness, or in the event of emergency or danger of death. Please call the office if you or a loved one needs to be anointed.

Infant & Child Baptism: For children under the age of 8, please submit the forms at stelizabethgc.org/baptism and sign up for a Baptism Preparation class at least a month before your desired date of Baptism. For questions or emergencies, please contact the Parish Office. Baptisms are usually celebrated after the 10:30 Mass most Sundays or at 7 p.m. some Wednesdays.

Matrimony: To begin preparation for Holy Matrimony, please contact the parish office to set up initial appointments and preparation at least six months (recommended twelve months) before your desired date. At least an introductory interview must be completed before a date can be set.

Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, first Holy Communion) for children 8 and over, or for adults: Contact the parish office.

PASTORAL CARE

Entering the Church: If you are new to the Catholic faith and interested in learning more about the church or about entering the church, welcome! Contact the parish office for a meeting with Father Alfred or Deacon Michael.

Communion to the Homebound: If you or a family member are, or are going to be, homebound, whether at home or in a care facility, please notify the parish office. Medical and care facilities are unable to inform us of their Catholic residents and patients. We would be happy to arrange to visit and bring you Holy Communion. Please contact the parish office for arrangements.

Declarations of Nullity: In some cases, a man or a woman desires healing through a declaration by a Church tribunal (a Catholic Church court), which does not deny that a relationship existed, but simply states that the relationship was missing something that the Church requires for a valid marriage, falling short of at least one of the essential elements required for a binding union. (Commonly called an 'annulment.') Father Alfred, Deacon Michael, and Laura Black are available as Advocates before our diocesan tribunal for those needing assistance with declarations of nullity. Call the parish office to set up an appointment.
