This Sunday: 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time 2 Kgs 4:8-11,14-16a; Rom 6:3-4,8-11; Mt 10:37-42 In the first reading, Elisha is warmly received by a woman of influence. In recognition of her hospitality, he promises her a baby son. In the second reading, Saint Paul tells the community that, by dying with Christ, we find our way to new life. In the Gospel, Jesus teaches his Apostles that those who lose their life for his sake will ultimately find fulfillment.

Next Sunday: 14th Sunday in Ordinary Time Zech 9:9-10; Rom 8:9, 11-13; Mt 11:25-30 A prophecy from Zechariah tells of the Messiah coming into Jerusalem riding a donkey, proclaiming peace. His kingdom will stretch over the whole world. Saint Paul encourages the Romans to live according to the Spirit, not worldly desires. In the Gospel, Jesus praises his Father for the wisdom of revealing himself to the meek. Those who are burdened can find rest in him.

GC ROCK Update - A Note from Woody & Rita Halbrook

Editor's Note: GC Rock has served the high school youth of the three parishes across Granite City, Madison, and Venice for the last nine years. We at St. Elizabeth parish are grateful for the efforts and leadership of Woody and Rita over the years and wish them all of God's blessings as they move on to their new ministry efforts. We would like to thank Dawn Wright for her support and leadership of this ministry on behalf of the parish as well! God bless you all and thank you.

To the Parishioners of Holy Family, St. Elizabeth, and St. Mary/St. Mark Parishes,

GC Rock Youth Group originated 9 years ago in the summer of 2014, with a packed St. Anthony Room at Holy Family Community Center. It was a room full of eager high school kids with huge ideas, and lots of pizza. We had a huge vision and knew that forming this group of high school youth was something our three parishes needed desperately. With the support and Blessing of Father Chris and Father Jeff, we reached out and met with two women, 'the best" at youth ministry, at Our Mother of Perpetual Help. They shared with us so many ideas on how to make this happen... And so, it began!

We started the youth group in the perfect direction with a day retreat at St. Boniface called "Shine your Light" on November 8, 2014...and the kids were hooked, and we were too! By the spring of 2015, "our kids" named their group GC Rock, because "God's Children DO Rock". Since our first "Gathering" we have enjoyed every single moment spent with each of the precious children that the parents of our high school youth have entrusted with us. We did the best we could at offering opportunities to share our Faith and taking them on Life-affirming trips. We have always encouraged service to others including the children, the elderly, and the homeless in our community. We have also enjoyed and will treasure some mighty fun outings filled with faith and fellowship with our Rocks!

In the summer of 2015, we took a van loaded with youth to St. Catharine College in Kentucky to attend our first Ignite Your Torch Youth Conference. We spent the next 4 summers taking Rocks to Ignite Your Torch in Kentucky and Alabama! We have had high school youth participate in Theology of the Body retreats as well as attending the Diocesan summer retreat in Springfield, Called and Sent. Each summer we have encouraged Rocks to come to the tri-parish Totus Tuus week retreat and we have encouraged them to help direct the younger children during the Totus Tuus day sessions.

In January 2016, with your prayers and support, our youth boarded one of 5 buses with over 200 youth pilgrims from this area and headed to Washington DC for OUR FIRST Vigil Mass for Life at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception and March for Life! In January, for the next 5 years, we took our Rocks to stand and March for Life with thousands of youth in Washington DC.

We have sold countless mason jars of our homemade cookie and soup mixes, Krispy Kreme donuts, Gus's Pretzels, St. Louis Cardinal calendars, and built our famous "Brick Money Wall" to make these trips AND activities possible. YOU, our parishes, supported us in everything! We are so grateful for the support you gave to our GC Rock kids.

So now, with much prayer and discerning, (and many tears), after 9 years as mentors of GC Rock we have made the very difficult decision to step back. We can hope and pray that we can pass the GC Rock legacy on to someone younger who has a love of our Faith and LOTS of energy...someone who sees the importance of keeping our high school youth that attend both public and private schools together. If not, we know that all is well in God's time. We ask you to pray with us that the new Young Disciples of St. Elizabeth Church will welcome and succeed in keeping the youth of our parishes together.

We are beyond thankful and have been blessed so tremendously by the ministry that was entrusted to us with the children of our parishes for as long as we have been able to do so.

Through some mighty challenging months in this past year, we have learned even more clearly that when a door closes, God has a way of opening a new one to serve "his children". A message in his homily on Pentecost Sunday, Deacon Michael shared such a message that resonated in our hearts that God's timing is so perfect... "Each of us is called. Each of us is given different kinds of spiritual gifts, but the same Spirit, different forms of service, but the same Lord. Different workings, but the same God who produces all of them in everyone. Through the gift of the Holy Spirit, we each receive all the strength, all the gifts to do what God calls us to do, in Jesus's name."



SACRAMENTS

Reconciliation: If you have been away from the Church and the Sacrament of Reconciliation for a while, feel free to contact the parish office for guidance & materials to help you prepare to return to the Sacraments. In addition to Confessions offered from 3-4 p.m. on Saturdays, you could also schedule an individual time for Reconciliation.

Anointing of the Sick: Anointing of the Sick is appropriate for any upcoming surgery, prolonged illness, or in the event of emergency or danger of death. Please call the office if you or a loved one needs to be anointed.

Infant & Child Baptism: For children under the age of 8, please submit the forms at stelizabethgc.org/baptism and sign up for a Baptism Preparation class at least a month before your desired date of Baptism. For questions or emergencies, please contact the Parish Office. Baptisms are usually celebrated after the 10:30 Mass most Sundays or at 7 p.m. some Wednesdays.

Matrimony: To begin preparation for Holy Matrimony, please contact the parish office to set up initial appointments and preparation at least six months (recommended twelve months) before your desired date. At least an introductory interview must be completed before a date can be set.

Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, first Holy Communion) for children 8 and over, or for adults: Contact the parish office.

PASTORAL CARE

Entering the Church: If you are new to the Catholic faith and interested in learning more about the church or about entering the church, welcome! Contact the parish office for a meeting with Father Alfred or Deacon Michael.

Communion to the Homebound: If you or a family member are, or are going to be, homebound, whether at home or in a care facility, please notify the parish office. Medical and care facilities are unable to inform us of their Catholic residents and patients. We would be happy to arrange to visit and bring you Holy Communion. Please contact the parish office for arrangements.

Declarations of Nullity: In some cases, a man or a woman desires healing through a declaration by a Church tribunal (a Catholic Church court), which does not deny that a relationship existed, but simply states that the relationship was missing something that the Church requires for a valid marriage, falling short of at least one of the essential elements required for a binding union. (Commonly called an 'annulment.') Father Alfred, Deacon Michael, and Laura Black are available as Advocates before our diocesan tribunal for those needing assistance with declarations of nullity. Call the parish office to set up an appointment.
