EUCHARISTIC MIRACLE PANELS (with a correction)

Catholics from across the diocese have been wowed to read and view 151 true eucharistic miracle stories from across the world over the centuries, depicted through photographs and historical descriptions on panels temporarily set up in parish centers, gyms, and vestibules. Several parishes in our diocese have already hosted this display, called the Vatican Eucharistic Miracles of the World exhibit. This exhibit was gifted to the Diocese of Springfield in Illinois and is available to parishes and schools in the diocese free of charge.

St. Elizabeth is blessed to have been able to purchase a full, printed set of these miracle panels with help from the men of the Holy Name Men's Club. We mistakenly reported that these were obtained with help from our local Knights of Columbus Council, but that was in error. These panels are on regular rotating display in the gathering space each week. Take a moment before or after Mass each week to check them out.

The exhibit presents some of the principal Eucharistic miracles that took place throughout the ages in various countries of the world which have been recognized by the church. By means of the panels, one can "virtually visit" the places where the miracles took place.



PARISH PICNIC UPDATE



Wanted to take time out to say THANKS!!! The 2023 Picnic was a success for a number of reasons. We made some adjustments with our hours of operation and the changes were very positive. Closing at 11:00 on Friday and Saturday was successful, allowing the various booths and workers to "finish" earlier without negatively impacting the "bottom line". We initially decided to close at 6:00 on Sunday to make sure that we had the available resources to tear the camp down on Sunday night. We can probably extend this to 7:00 next year but will continue to look at numbers to see if the reward is realized. Will make that decision later this year as to when we will actually close.

We kept costs down with less expensive bands for Friday and Saturday and not having to pay for a band on Sunday. This was a BIG expense save.

The biggest success was closing early on Sunday. Implementing a need to have each booth staff as if we were to be open until 10:00 allowed the effort to provide the necessary resources to effectively tear down the entire camp. We were able to get most of the camp torn down and put into the barn that night....just leaving some minor things to address on Monday morning. Historically, the Monday tear down has experienced such a gap in resources that made the effort of tearing down the camp extremely difficult and challenging to the staff that normally represented on that Monday. This was TRULY a parish effort and the teamwork and willingness to meet this demand was very much appreciated and inspiring.

We are still gathering some left over invoices that will need to be paid but overall, the numbers look great. I know that we are over \$200,000 gross and hope to have more finalized numbers for you all in the coming months. (Realize that this is a "gross" amount....and the actual profit will be a percentage of this amount.).

Again, BIG THANK YOU to all who made this successful..... especially Bud, Mike and his crew, Dennis Krystopa, Rob Hutson, Andy Yurko, Paul Mills, Beth Dittman, Michelle Williams, Loretta Joyce, Bret Ware, Jackie Jones, Father Alfred, and ALL of the chairman. The hours of preparation leading up to this picnic and the hours spend AFTER the picnic are incredible. The dedication and the spirit of these people....along with the hours that the parents and parishioners work during the picnic helps us realize success....regardless of what obstacles/challenges we might encounter throughout the event.

Although Mary and I have moved to another city, the parish family of St. Elizabeth will ALWAYS be home for me and Mary.

This Is My Why

I wanted to share something that was placed on my heart at 10:30 am Mass this past Sunday as well as at Vespers. I believe it was inspired from great sharing and conversation happening at the [Lamb's Supper] book study,

this past weekend at Mass. Granted... I do realize this is vacation time and I don't know the attendance numbers at the other weekend Masses, but it really looked noticeably sparse. Some have shared at book study that some parishioners have said to them that they don't plan on returning to in person Mass when streaming Mass at home is more convenient and comfortable. Now don't get me wrong.... I think streaming was a wonderful option we were blessed to have during COVID and I still think many benefits to keeping that option, especially for the homebound or the sick who cannot physically attend. I additionally think it is helpful to supplement our prayer life.... but not to take the place of in person Mass.

During 10:30 Mass, this question came to my mind....maybe we need to ask parishioners that say they don't want to return to in person Mass "What would it take to bring you back?"



Matrimony: To begin preparation for Holy Matrimony, please contact the parish office to set up initial appointments and preparation at least six months (recommended twelve months) before your desired date. At least an introductory interview must be completed before a date can be set.

Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, first Holy Communion) for children 8 and over, or for adults: Contact the parish office.

PASTORAL CARE

Entering the Church: If you are new to the Catholic faith and interested in learning more about the church or about entering the church, welcome! Contact the parish office for a meeting with Father Alfred or Deacon Michael.

Communion to the Homebound: If you or a family member are, or are going to be, homebound, whether at home or in a care facility, please notify the parish office. Medical and care facilities are unable to inform us of their Catholic residents and patients. We would be happy to arrange to visit and bring you Holy Communion. Please contact the parish office for arrangements.

Declarations of Nullity: In some cases, a man or a woman desires healing through a declaration by a Church tribunal (a Catholic Church court), which does not deny that a relationship existed, but simply states that the relationship was missing something that the Church requires for a valid marriage, falling short of at least one of the essential elements required for a binding union. (Commonly called an 'annulment.') Father Alfred, Deacon Michael, and Laura Black are available as Advocates before our diocesan tribunal for those needing assistance with declarations of nullity. Call the parish office to set up an appointment.
