



I expect that during these months many of us/families travel to the lakes and parks, have cookouts, and travel out of states/country to enjoy the warm, sunny (humid) weather and change of location. Meanwhile, some of you have been asking me if I will be traveling to Uganda this summer, as I have always done. I was and will not be able to travel to Uganda due to school summer courses that I have had to take as a requirement towards the completion of my Doctoral studies in Health Care Mission Leadership in August 2024. Please join me in prayer thanking God, and all those supporting me on my enormous journey. Nevertheless, I hope to travel early next year!

On a good note, I will be traveling to the Archdiocese of Guadalajara, to attend and concelebrate at the mass of the perpetual profession of my Cousin Sister Restetuta Nakacwa, of the sisters of the "Congregación de María Reparadora" (Sisters of Mary Reparatrix) in the city of Jalisco Mexico, due to take place on Sunday, July 23, 2023, at the Parish of San Lázaro, Polanco Deanery, Vicariate of Nuestra Señora de Lourdes, Guadalajara, Jalisco (Mexico). Perpetual Profession marks the beginning of Sister Restetuta's total commitment to follow in the footsteps of Christ through a life of poverty, obedience, and chastity, as a sister of Sisters of Mary Reparatrix. Please join me to pray for her total commitment to serving the Lord as a religious nun. The weekend I am gone, (from Friday, July 21, to Tuesday, July 25, 2023), I have asked Fr. Charles Niwagaba, who has been invited to our Diocese of Springfield in Illinois through the mission office MCP program to help do the mission appeal for my home Archdiocese of Mbarara, to help with Sacramental ministry while staying with us at St. Elizabeth Parish (Granite City) parish rectory.

SACRAMENTS

Reconciliation: If you have been away from the Church and the Sacrament of Reconciliation for a while, feel free to contact the parish office for guidance & materials to help you prepare to return to the Sacraments. In addition to Confessions offered from 3-4 p.m. on Saturdays, you could also schedule an individual time for Reconciliation.

Anointing of the Sick: Anointing of the Sick is appropriate for any upcoming surgery, prolonged illness, or in the event of emergency or danger of death. Please call the office if you or a loved one needs to be anointed.

Infant & Child Baptism: For children under the age of 8, please submit the forms at stelizabethgc.org/baptism and sign up for a Baptism Preparation class at least a month before your desired date of Baptism. For questions or emergencies, please contact the Parish Office. Baptisms are usually celebrated after the 10:30 Mass most Sundays or at 7 p.m. some Wednesdays.

Matrimony: To begin preparation for Holy Matrimony, please contact the parish office to set up initial appointments and preparation at least six months (recommended twelve months) before your desired date. At least an introductory interview must be completed before a date can be set.

Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, first Holy Communion) for children 8 and over, or for adults: Contact the parish office.

PASTORAL CARE

Entering the Church: If you are new to the Catholic faith and interested in learning more about the church or about entering the church, welcome! Contact the parish office for a meeting with Father Alfred or Deacon Michael.

Communion to the Homebound: If you or a family member are, or are going to be, homebound, whether at home or in a care facility, please notify the parish office. Medical and care facilities are unable to inform us of their Catholic residents and patients. We would be happy to arrange to visit and bring you Holy Communion. Please contact the parish office for arrangements.

Declarations of Nullity: In some cases, a man or a woman desires healing through a declaration by a Church tribunal (a Catholic Church court), which does not deny that a relationship existed, but simply states that the relationship was missing something that the Church requires for a valid marriage, falling short of at least one of the essential elements required for a binding union. (Commonly called an 'annulment.') Father Alfred, Deacon Michael, and Laura Black are available as Advocates before our diocesan tribunal for those needing assistance with declarations of nullity. Call the parish office to set up an appointment.
