3rd - 8th graders can purchase everyday of the week.

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Job Search Training Session Series at 2001 Delmar Avenue

Secretary of State and State Librarian Jesse White awarded nearly \$6 million in pandemic recovery grants to libraries focused on responding directly to the COVID-19 pandemic by modifying services, transforming spaces and developing resources for their local recovering workforce. Funding 211 academic, school, special and public libraries, all of which received grants ranging from \$5,000 to over \$1 million. A combination of funding sources

provided through the federal American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) and Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA), both from the Institute of Museum and Library Services, and state technology funds were used to maximize the statewide impact.

SMRLD is the proud recipient of \$50,000 of funding from the Illinois State Library's (ISL) Bouncing Back from the Pandemic grant. As a part of our project, Building a Job Ready Workforce, expert Frank Alaniz will be presenting a series of job search training sessions.
