UPCOMING MISSION APPEAL

Our annual Diocesan Mission Appeal will take place the weekend of August 19-20. Here is a message with a bit of background information about the ministry that will visit us, St. Dominic Mission Society.

St. Dominic Mission Society is the foreign mission organization of the Dominican Friars of the Province of St. Albert the Great (Central USA). Our principal foreign mission is in Puerto Rico.

Presently our greatest needs there are:

- Scholarships: Families in need due to earthquakes and hurricanes, who have students at our gradeschool and high school at Nuestra Señora del Rosario parish in Yauco. 300 students x \$1000 each = \$300,000;
- Restoration of Priory: Need for completion of restoration of the Dominican Friars' house in Yauco, severely damaged by a 6.8 magnitude earthquake in January 2020 (\$100,000).

FROM OUR PASTOR

Pastoral Visit of the Bishop



Praised be Jesus Christ! Last year 2022, we scheduled and requested our Bishop to give us a Parish Pastoral Visit. I am delighted to announce that our Bishop Thomas John Paprocki will be visiting our family of God here at Saint Elizabeth Parish in Granite City on Saturday, August 26 and Sunday, August 27. Canon Law 396 §1: 'A bishop is obliged to visit the diocese annually either in whole or in part, so that he visits the entire diocese at least every five years either personally or, if he has been legitimately impeded, through the coadjutor bishop, an auxiliary, vicar general, episcopal vicar, or another presbyter.' According to the Directory for the Pastoral Ministry of Bishops "Apostolorum Successores": 'The pastoral visit is an apostolic endeavor, an event of grace.'

What will happen during the pastoral visit of the Bishop?

During the Bishops pastoral visit, he will be particularly interested to hear about our efforts around each of the Four Pillars of Discipleship and Stewardship of our diocese (parish): Hospitality, Prayer, Formation and Service, and all that we do that make our parish life and faith beautiful and learn about our programs and activities that contribute to sacramental life and our Christian life.

The celebration of the Saturday and Sunday Masses are the spiritual heart of parish life. For this reason, Bishop Paprocki will be the celebrant and homilist at all our scheduled weekend Masses (Sat., 4:30 pm; Sun., 8:00am and 10:30am - to be live streamed). The 10:30am will be a youth Mass, led by our kids (choir, lectors, servers), and the bishop will bless the students and their backpacks as they begin the new school year. Bishop Paprocki would like to be in front of as many parishioners as possible at Mass, after Mass, and at Harmony Cafe hosted by St. Elizabeth Preschool Team following each mass. He will also need to meet with all our Councils only (Parish Pastoral and Finance Councils, School Board), to be held after lunch on Sunday.

Goals of the Pastoral Visit

This will help him, as our bishop, to come to a deeper appreciation of the life of the Christian community at Saint Elizabeth Parish and School and certainly, an overview of what the parish is already doing in each area of the four pillars, but also to get everyone brainstorming about what more the Lord might have in mind in those areas.

It will also give him an opportunity to get to know the parish/school and give parishioners/school parents an opportunity to meet with the Bishop, to discuss our parish/school and parish life and to get to know him as shepherd and chief pastor in a deeper way.

Everybody (parishioner/school parent) is invited to take part in this event. The presence of a bishop is a blessing to our parish and school when he visits. If you have suggestions, questions, or maybe something no one thought of or that will be really helpful, share it with me through the parish office. Thank you all for your discipleship and stewardship. Pray now and moving forward that this visit is productive and allows us all to collaborate together and with our Bishop to reach out and grow our parish/school!

To celebrate the Year of the Eucharist going on in our diocese right now and the 100th anniversary of the transfer of the See city of our diocese from Alton to Springfield, a Eucharistic Congress is taking place Saturday, October 28 at the BOS Center in Springfield. You are invited! Doors open at 10:30 a.m. with the first speaker starting at 1 p.m., and Mass begins at 4 p.m.



This Eucharistic Congress will be a spiritually uplifting and motivating event featuring talks from nationally popular Catholic speakers Sister M. Karolyn Nunes, FSGM, Father Chase Hilgenbrinck, Father Denis Robinson, OSB, and Dr. Scott Hahn. SACRAMENTS

Reconciliation: If you have been away from the Church and the Sacrament of Reconciliation for a while, feel free to contact the parish office for guidance & materials to help you prepare to return to the Sacraments. In addition to Confessions offered from 3-4 p.m. on Saturdays, you could also schedule an individual time for Reconciliation.

Anointing of the Sick: Anointing of the Sick is appropriate for any upcoming surgery, prolonged illness, or in the event of emergency or danger of death. Please call the office if you or a loved one needs to be anointed.

Infant & Child Baptism: For children under the age of 8, please submit the forms at stelizabethgc.org/baptism and sign up for a Baptism Preparation class at least a month before your desired date of Baptism. For questions or emergencies, please contact the Parish Office. Baptisms are usually celebrated after the 10:30 Mass most Sundays or at 7 p.m. some Wednesdays.

Matrimony: To begin preparation for Holy Matrimony, please contact the parish office to set up initial appointments and preparation at least six months (recommended twelve months) before your desired date. At least an introductory interview must be completed before a date can be set.


Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, first Holy Communion) for children 8 and over, or for adults: Contact the parish office.

PASTORAL CARE


Entering the Church: If you are new to the Catholic faith and interested in learning more about the church or about entering the church, welcome! Contact the parish office for a meeting with Father Alfred or Deacon Michael.


Communion to the Homebound: If you or a family member are, or are going to be, homebound, whether at home or in a care facility, please notify the parish office. Medical and care facilities are unable to inform us of their Catholic residents and patients. We would be happy to arrange to visit and bring you Holy Communion. Please contact the parish office for arrangements.

Declarations of Nullity: In some cases, a man or a woman desires healing through a declaration by a Church tribunal (a Catholic Church court), which does not deny that a relationship existed, but simply states that the relationship was missing something that the Church requires for a valid marriage, falling short of at least one of the essential elements required for a binding union. (Commonly called an ‘annulment.’) Father Alfred, Deacon Michael, and Laura Black are available as Advocates before our diocesan tribunal for those needing assistance with declarations of nullity. Call the parish office to set up an appointment.
