Time Is 56:1, 6-7; Rom 11:13-15, 29-32; Mt 15:21-28 In the first reading, Isaiah tells the people to observe what is right and do what is just, for God's salvation is about to come for all who hold to his covenant. Paul writes that he is the apostle to the Gentiles, for God has delivered them too. In the Gospel, Jesus heals the daughter of a Canaanite woman because the woman's faith is great.

Next Sunday: 21st Sunday in Ord. Time Is 22:19-23; Rom 11:33-36; Mt 16:13-20 In the first reading, Eliakim is given the tokens of the master of the palace and the Lord gives him authority over the palace to be a father to all Jerusalem. Saint Paul writes to the Romans that God's knowledge and wisdom are unfathomable. In the Gospel, when Jesus asks who the crowds say he is, the disciples give varied answers. Peter answers correctly and Jesus gives him the keys of the kingdom.

Vincent Davila, OP both of St. Dominic Mission Society. As we have always been generous to our brothers and sisters in need, let join



the Office for the Missions in our diocese in cooperation with the Missionary Cooperative Program of the Pontifical Mission Society, and the universal Catholic Church in our support of the missions. This gives us the opportunity to directly participate in the Church's mission work by our prayers and financial assistance, for St. Dominic Mission Society to meet their needs. Pastoral Visit of the Bishop

Last year 2022, we scheduled and requested our Bishop to give us a Parish Pastoral Visit. I am delighted to announce that our Bishop Thomas John Paprocki will be visiting our family of God here at Saint Elizabeth Parish in Granite City on Saturday, August 26 and Sunday, August 27.

What will happen during the pastoral visit of the Bishop?

During the Bishops pastoral visit, he will be particularly interested to hear about our efforts around each of the Four Pillars of Discipleship and Stewardship of our diocese (parish): Hospitality, Prayer, Formation and Service, and all that we do that make our parish life and faith beautiful and learn about our programs and activities that contribute to sacramental life and our Christian life.

The celebration of the Saturday and Sunday Masses are the spiritual heart of parish life. For this reason, Bishop Paprocki will be the celebrant and homilist at all our scheduled weekend Masses (Sat., 4:30 pm; Sun., 8:00am and 10:30am - to be live streamed). The 10:30am will be a youth Mass, led by our kids (choir, lectors, servers), and the bishop will bless the students and their backpacks as they begin the new school year. Bishop Paprocki would like to be in front of as many parishioners as possible at Mass, after Mass, and at Harmony Cafe hosted by St. Elizabeth Preschool Team following each mass. He will also need to meet with all our Councils only (Parish Pastoral and Finance Councils, School Board), to be held after lunch on Sunday.

Goals of the Pastoral Visit

This will help him, as our bishop, to come to a deeper appreciation of the life of the Christian community at Saint Elizabeth Parish and School and certainly, an overview of what the parish is already doing in each area of the four pillars, but also to get everyone brainstorming about what more the Lord might have in mind in those areas.

It will also give him an opportunity to get to know the parish/school and give parishioners/school parents an opportunity to meet with the Bishop, to discuss our parish/school and parish life and to get to know him as shepherd and chief pastor in a deeper way.

Everybody (parishioner/school parent) is invited to take part in this event. The presence of a bishop is a blessing to our parish and school when he visits. If you have suggestions, questions, or maybe something no one thought of or that will be really helpful, share it with me through the parish office. Thank you all for your discipleship and stewardship. Pray now and moving forward that this visit is productive and allows us all to collaborate together and with our Bishop to reach out and grow our parish/school!

CELEBRATING SUNDAYS FOR CATHOLIC FAMILIES

This week, we are going to begin sharing a bit of supplemental information that can be used to help families get more out of Mass. This information is from a book called 'Celebrating Sunday for Catholic Families' by Kerri Mecke-Lazano. It includes the Gospel, a reflection, a question to ponder before AND after Mass as well as a section called Living the Word to consider how you can take the Gospel with you for the rest of the week. Please use them to help you and your family get more out of the Mass each week!

HEARING THE WORD: Read Matthew 15:21-28

REFLECTING ON THE WORD

Did you know that almost everything we say in the Mass is from the Bible? When we know the stories behind the words we say, what we profess has so much more meaning. In today's Gospel, we hear a woman say to Jesus, "Have pity on me, Lord," or said in another way, "Have mercy on me, Lord." We say these powerful words at Mass when we are asking God to forgive us. In this moment we are repeating the Canaanite woman's plea for help. She had so much faith that even the "scraps" of his power were enough for her. Jesus knew that her faith would be an example to his own disciples! May she also be an example to us!

ON THE WAY TO MASS

Pay attention to the Penitential Act at the beginning of Mass. Why is it important to ask for God's mercy and forgiveness at the start of the Mass?

ON THE WAY HOME FROM MASS

Jesus says that the Canaanite woman has great faith. How does she show great faith? How can we have faith like she does?

LIVING THE WORD

The words "Lord, have mercy" are sometimes repeated or sung in Greek, which is the original language of the Gospel accounts. As a family, explore the different ways this prayer can be said or sung:

Greek: Kyrie eleison. Christe eleison. Kyrie eleison. English: Lord, have mercy. Christ, have mercy. Lord, have mercy.

Discuss which way each person prefers and why.

WEEKLY STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION


"For the gifts and the call of God are irrevocable" - Romans 11:29

SACRAMENTS

Reconciliation: If you have been away from the Church and the Sacrament of Reconciliation for a while, feel free to contact the parish office for guidance & materials to help you prepare to return to the Sacraments. In addition to Confessions offered from 3-4 p.m. on Saturdays, you could also schedule an individual time for Reconciliation.

Anointing of the Sick: Anointing of the Sick is appropriate for any upcoming surgery, prolonged illness, or in the event of emergency or danger of death. Please call the office if you or a loved one needs to be anointed.

Infant & Child Baptism: For children under the age of 8, please submit the forms at stelizabethgc.org/baptism and sign up for a Baptism Preparation class at least a month before your desired date of Baptism. For questions or emergencies, please contact the Parish Office. Baptisms are usually celebrated after the 10:30 Mass most Sundays or at 7 p.m. some Wednesdays.

Matrimony: To begin preparation for Holy Matrimony, please contact the parish office to set up initial appointments and preparation at least six months (recommended twelve months) before your desired date. At least an introductory interview must be completed before a date can be set.

Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, first Holy Communion) for children 8 and over, or for adults: Contact the parish office.

PASTORAL CARE

Entering the Church: If you are new to the Catholic faith and interested in learning more about the church or about entering the church, welcome! Contact the parish office for a meeting with Father Alfred or Deacon Michael.

Communion to the Homebound: If you or a family member are, or are going to be, homebound, whether at home or in a care facility, please notify the parish office. Medical and care facilities are unable to inform us of their Catholic residents and patients. We would be happy to arrange to visit and bring you Holy Communion. Please contact the parish office for arrangements.

Declarations of Nullity: In some cases, a man or a woman desires healing through a declaration by a Church tribunal (a Catholic Church court), which does not deny that a relationship existed, but simply states that the relationship was missing something that the Church requires for a valid marriage, falling short of at least one of the essential elements required for a binding union. (Commonly called an 'annulment.') Father Alfred, Deacon Michael, and Laura Black are available as Advocates before our diocesan tribunal for those needing assistance with declarations of nullity. Call the parish office to set up an appointment.
