Celebrating Catechetical Sunday

The word "Catechetical" might be more familiar than you think. The root word, "catechesis," is from a Greek word meaning "to echo, or resound." Catechesis is the act of resounding or bringing the Church's teachings to the world. A catechist is one who teaches in the name of the Church.

On Catechetical Sunday, those whom the community has designated to serve as catechists are called to be commissioned for their ministry. Catechetical Sunday is a wonderful opportunity to reflect on the role that each person plays, by virtue of Baptism, in handing on the faith and being a witness to the Gospel. Catechetical Sunday is an opportunity for all to rededicate themselves to this mission as a community of faith.

Catechesis is a distinct and special ministry in the Church. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church makes clear, "Catechesis is intimately bound up with the whole of the Church's life . . . her inner growth and correspondence with God's plan depend essentially on catechesis" (no. 7). This ministry of teaching in the name of the Church has a profound dignity, which is why catechists are formally commissioned by the Church. It is only fitting that we set aside a day to highlight this ministry and invite the entire church community to think about our responsibility to share our faith with others.

Parents are truly the primary catechists of their children. They prepare the soil and plant the first seeds of faith. On Catechetical Sunday, we not only highlight the work of catechists in parishes and schools, but we also commend parents and guardians and encourage them to take seriously their role of making their Catholic households a place where faith is passed on to the next generation. This is why the rite of blessing of catechists used on Catechetical Sunday includes an optional blessing of parents and guardians.



Centennial Campaign Kickoff

This week you should receive a letter in the mail from Father Alfred, sharing some details about the Diocesan Centennial Campaign. As Bishop Paprocki explained during his pastoral visit last month, our diocese is committed to fostering the faith intentionally through the four pillars of hospitality, prayer, formation and service. The Centennial Campaign is made up of three essential elements that each parish is being asked to consider:

1.Conduct a Parish Vitality Study to discern how our parish mission impacts the community and to ensure funding well into the future for the campus, mission priorities and ministry growth. This report will be completed by parish staff and leaders, then reviewed by the Pastoral Planning 2025 team and the Parish Vitality Office. They will review and present a report that evaluates the parish input, diocesan statistical reporting, census data, and other metrics. This report will serve as a guidepost to evaluating parish participation and engage parish staff and leaders in discerning their mission priorities and effectiveness. determine project goals, timeline (all parish campaigns should be in an "active" phase by January 1, 2025), and if you will need fundraising council. The Office for Parish Vitality and Mission Advancement will assist our goals and recommendation for Catholic campaign consultants, as needed.

3. Conduct your Parish Centennial Campaign. An "active" campaign is one that has a start-end date, campaign fundraising goal, pledges accepted, and clear goals for renewal. Our goal should encompass mission priorities, campus needs, ministry and staffing needs, debt reduction, savings growth and long-term sustainability through participation in endowments. This campaign is not just about buildings, rather the people inside those buildings effectively going about the mission of the church.

You will have several opportunities for input in this process. Please use the opportunities provided over the next few weeks to share with us your ideas around this process. Prayerfully consider how you can be a more active participant in our parish and this campaign.







HEARING THE WORD: Read Matthew 18:21-22

REFLECTING ON THE WORD

Peter asks Jesus about a topic that is as challenging for us as it was for him: forgiveness! Whether we are six or sixty years old, we also have questions about forgiveness: How do we feel when people hurt us? Do we still love them? Do we carry anger in our heart? Do we try to hurt them back? Do we forgive them right away? Does it still hurt even after we forgive them? Jesus' words challenge us to choose forgiveness over and over again, and not let the questions that arise in our hearts keep us stuck in unforgiveness?

ON THE WAY TO MASS

The Mass is one great prayer made up of many prayers. Let us listen for the words sorry, forgive, mercy, and peace in today's liturgy. Are they words proclaimed by the priest, spoken by the assembly (us), or both?

ON THE WAY HOME FROM MASS

How can we bring our experience of conflict to Jesus and ask him for help in our time of need?

LIVING THE WORD

Each night this week, talk with your children about the moments during the day that they either asked someone for forgiveness or forgave someone. Did they ask Jesus for forgiveness? How do they feel after forgiving someone? How does it feel to know that Jesus forgives them?



WEEKLY STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION


"For if we live, we live for the Lord, and if we die, we die for the Lord; so then, whether we live or die, we are the Lord's." - Romans 14:8

SACRAMENTS

Reconciliation: If you have been away from the Church and the Sacrament of Reconciliation for a while, feel free to contact the parish office for guidance & materials to help you prepare to return to the Sacraments. In addition to Confessions offered from 3-4 p.m. on Saturdays, you could also schedule an individual time for Reconciliation.

Anointing of the Sick: Anointing of the Sick is appropriate for any upcoming surgery, prolonged illness, or in the event of emergency or danger of death. Please call the office if you or a loved one needs to be anointed.

Infant & Child Baptism: For children under the age of 8, please submit the forms at stelizabethgc.org/baptism and sign up for a Baptism Preparation class at least a month before your desired date of Baptism. For questions or emergencies, please contact the Parish Office. Baptisms are usually celebrated after the 10:30 Mass most Sundays or at 7 p.m. some Wednesdays.

Matrimony: To begin preparation for Holy Matrimony, please contact the parish office to set up initial appointments and preparation at least six months (recommended twelve months) before your desired date. At least an introductory interview must be completed before a date can be set.

Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, first Holy Communion) for children 8 and over, or for adults: Contact the parish office.

PASTORAL CARE

Entering the Church: If you are new to the Catholic faith and interested in learning more about the church or about entering the church, welcome! Contact the parish office for a meeting with Father Alfred or Deacon Michael.

Communion to the Homebound: If you or a family member are, or are going to be, homebound, whether at home or in a care facility, please notify the parish office. Medical and care facilities are unable to inform us of their Catholic residents and patients. We would be happy to arrange to visit and bring you Holy Communion. Please contact the parish office for arrangements.

Declarations of Nullity: In some cases, a man or a woman desires healing through a declaration by a Church tribunal (a Catholic Church court), which does not deny that a relationship existed, but simply states that the relationship was missing something that the Church requires for a valid marriage, falling short of at least one of the essential elements required for a binding union. (Commonly called an 'annulment.') Father Alfred, Deacon Michael, and Laura Black are available as Advocates before our diocesan tribunal for those needing assistance with declarations of nullity. Call the parish office to set up an appointment.
