
First Sunday of Lent ♦ February 18, 2024







Lent is the principal penitential season in the Church year. All the Christian faithful are urged to develop and maintain a voluntary program of self-denial (in addition to the Lenten regulations which follow), serious prayer, and the performing of deeds of charity and mercy, including the giving of alms.

Prayerully consider what your prayer, fasting, and almsgiving will include this year.

REMEMBER THE LENTEN REGULATIONS:

- 1. ABSTINENCE Everyone 14 years of age and over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.
- 2. FASTING Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 is required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is permitted. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength may be taken according to each person's needs, but together these two should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids (including milk and fruit juices) are allowed.
- 3. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.

This Sunday: 1st Sunday of Lent

Gen 9:8-15; 1 Pt 3:18-22; Mk 1:12-15

To repent means to feel regret and sorrow and to change, or "turn from" what is evil. Gospel is a word meaning "good news." To "repent and believe in the Gospel" is the twofold call of the Christian, which is brought into profound relief during the Lenten season. This time shows there is indeed cause for regret and sorrow, and a need for change. And yet, what we are turning toward is always cause for joy and hope.

Next Sunday: 2nd Sunday of Lent

Gen 22:1-2, 9a, 10-13, 15-18; Rom 8:31b-34; Mk 9:2-10 God calls Abraham to sacrifice Isaac, but provides a ram instead and promises blessing on all nations in response to Abraham's trust. In the Epistle, we are reminded that God did not spare his own Son and so gives us everything with him. In the Gospel, Jesus is transfigured and a voice from the cloud says: This is my beloved Son. Listen to him.

FEBRUARY 22 (this Thursday) THE FEAST OF THE CHAIR OF ST. PETER

This feast commemorates the contributions of the Apostle Peter to the Church and the importance of his role in the Church. It celebrates his authority and endless efforts to build a strong community around the teachings of Christ.

St. Peter was known to hold the keys to the kingdom of heaven, entrusted to him by Jesus himself. He is considered as the first Pope and the Feast of the Chair of St. Peter marks the longstanding Papacy in Rome since the 1st century.

One of the main reasons for celebrating the Feast of the Chair of St. Peter is to celebrate the unity of the Church in Peter and his successors, the Popes.

There were two chairs associated with Saint Peter, one kept in St. Peter's Basilica and the other in the Catacomb of Priscilla. Each of these chairs was revered and celebrated, however. because St. Peter's Basilica is the final resting place of the Apostle, the ancient oak chair in the Basilica is the one that is referred to as the Chair of St. Peter.

Initially, the Chair was kept inside the monastery of St. Martin, after which it was shifted to St. Peter's Basilica, where it sits today...

"By our little acts of charity practiced in the shade we convert souls far away, we help missionaries, we win for them abundant alms; and by that means build actual dwellings spiritual and material for our Eucharistic Lord... It is not to remain in a golden ciborium that He comes down each day from Heaven, but to find another Heaven, the Heaven of our soul in which He takes delight... You must open a little, or rather raise on high your corolla so that the Bread of Angels may come as divine dew to strengthen you, and to give you all that is wanting to you." - St. Therese of Lisieux, Doctor of the Church

CELEBRATING SUNDAYS FOR CATHOLIC FAMILIES

This is from 'Celebrating Sunday for Catholic Families' by Kerri Mecke-Lazano. HEARING THE WORD: Mark 1:12-15 **REFLECTING ON THE WORD:**

In today's Gospel, Jesus goes into the desert for forty days to pray and is tempted by Satan. He is among wild beasts, and the angels come to minister to him. Jesus needs this time of preparation before he begins his public ministry. What about our own preparation? Is it easy to prepare when illness, suffering, and temptation surround us? How do you prepare yourself and your family for those times that seem to be especially challenging?

ON THE WAY TO MASS

Sometimes we make good choices, and sometimes we are tempted to go against God's plan. Reflect on the last time you made a good choice that yielded harmony, unity, and peace.

ON THE WAY HOME FROM MASS

Jesus went to the desert to pray. What does that tell us about how we can prepare ourselves to make good choices? Praying and reading God's Word, the Bible, will help us stay close to him?

LIVING THE WORD

For your prayer table at home, find a piece of purple cloth, a purple scarf or pillowcase, or even some purple construction paper to place on the table. Changing the color of the cloth is a way for the children to focus on and to honor the same change that they will observe in the parish church. As a family, decide what other items will adorn your prayer table during Lent: a Bible, a candle, a crucifix? Is there a word or phrase from today's Gospel that you would like to include on your prayer table?

SACRAMENTS

Reconciliation: If you have been away from the Church and the Sacrament of Reconciliation for a while, feel free to contact the parish office for guidance & materials to help you prepare to return to the Sacraments. In addition to Confessions offered from 3-4 p.m. on Saturdays, you could also schedule an individual time for Reconciliation.

Anointing of the Sick: Anointing of the Sick is appropriate for any upcoming surgery, prolonged illness, or in the event of emergency or danger of death. Please call the office if you or a loved one needs to be anointed.

Infant & Child Baptism: For children under the age of 8, please submit the forms at stelizabethgc.org/baptism and sign up for a Baptism Preparation class at least a month before your desired date of Baptism. For questions or emergencies, please contact the Parish Office. Baptisms are usually celebrated after the 10:30 Mass most Sundays or at 7 p.m. some Wednesdays.

Matrimony: To begin preparation for Holy Matrimony, please contact the parish office to set up initial appointments and preparation at least six months (recommended twelve months) before your desired date. At least an introductory interview must be completed before a date can be set.

Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, first Holy Communion) for children 8 and over, or for adults: Contact the parish office.

PASTORAL CARE

Entering the Church: If you are new to the Catholic faith and interested in learning more about the church or about entering the church, welcome! Contact the parish office for a meeting with Father Alfred or Deacon Michael.

Communion to the Homebound: If you or a family member are, or are going to be, homebound, whether at home or in a care facility, please notify the parish office. Medical and care facilities are unable to inform us of their Catholic residents and patients. We would be happy to arrange to visit and bring you Holy Communion. Please contact the parish office for arrangements.

Declarations of Nullity: In some cases, a man or a woman desires healing through a declaration by a Church tribunal (a Catholic Church court), which does not deny that a relationship existed, but simply states that the relationship was missing something that the Church requires for a valid marriage, falling short of at least one of the essential elements required for a binding union. (Commonly called an 'annulment.') Father Alfred, Deacon Michael, and Laura Black are available as Advocates before our diocesan tribunal for those needing assistance with declarations of nullity. Call the parish office to set up an appointment.
