DID YOU KNOW? MINISTRY TO THE HOMEBOUND

Following up on the survey responses regarding outreach: There were parishioners that commented we should be taking Holy Communion to our homebound parishioners.

In fact, we do have an outreach to our homebound that have requested receiving communion. Along with Father Alfred, Deacon Michael, Deacon Daniel, Seminarian Devin, and a team of Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, we take communion through the week and on weekends.

You may have seen the black burses worn around the neck by some Eucharistic Ministers. We wear burses to safely and discretely carry the golden pyxes holding consecrated hosts to the homebound. The hosts are carried in a small round gold pyx held within the burse to keep Jesus safe on our journey.

We know that we are not worthy to take Jesus out of his home, but we are willing to prepare ourselves to do the service for the Glory of God. The Eucharistic Ministers often take time to visit with the homebound, take them bulletins, and any other handouts: such as prayer books, palms, and sometimes goodies from the Harmony Café.

The homebound parishioners are very humble and gracious, and sometimes feel like they are taking up too much of our time. That is not the case. The blessings we receive by doing this ministry outweighs any loss of time. Everyone who helps with this ministry expresses what a joy and a blessing it is to be able to take part in it, even if they're just taking Communion to only one person any given Sunday.

If you know of a parishioner that needs this ministry, even if for a brief period after illness or surgery, please reach out to the parish office, and it will be determined if we can add them to our list.

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion: If you are not doing this ministry yet, please consider getting approved and trained. At this time, we have enough that the rotation is usually once a month to visit a few

people, but with addition of new names we may need more to help. Or you could consistently visit one person each weekend and ease the burden on the rest of the rotating team.

Zoey Cholevik, 2 year and 4 month old daughter of Daniel and Dawn was diagnosed with cystic fibrosis when she was born and is also in dire need of a liver transplant. The problem is that the liver has to be from a child. This is a very difficult situation as how does one pray for a child to pass in order that another one is to live?

We have all witnessed or heard of children with terrible diseases and we do pray for their healing and we have all had loved ones that have fallen ill and asked for prayers for healing. As a member of Men at Prayer and look at the list of all those who have requested prayers for themselves or others our members know that our parishioners are convinced that prayer is so important. Our family are asking for daily prayers for the healing of Zoey. We also ask for prayers for Dawn and Daniel. I must mention Skylar, Zoeys' sister. SACRAMENTS

Reconciliation: If you have been away from the Church and the Sacrament of Reconciliation for a while, feel free to contact the parish office for guidance & materials to help you prepare to return to the Sacraments. In addition to Confessions offered from 3-4 p.m. on Saturdays, you could also schedule an individual time for Reconciliation.

Anointing of the Sick: Anointing of the Sick is appropriate for any upcoming surgery, prolonged illness, or in the event of emergency or danger of death. Please call the office if you or a loved one needs to be anointed.

Infant & Child Baptism: For children under the age of 8, please submit the forms at stelizabethgc.org/baptism and sign up for a Baptism Preparation class at least a month before your desired date of Baptism. For questions or emergencies, please contact the Parish Office. Baptisms are usually celebrated after the 10:30 Mass most Sundays or at 7 p.m. some Wednesdays.

Matrimony: To begin preparation for Holy Matrimony, please contact the parish office to set up initial appointments and preparation at least six months (recommended twelve months) before your desired date. At least an introductory interview must be completed before a date can be set.

Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, first Holy Communion) for children 8 and over, or for adults: Contact the parish office.

PASTORAL CARE

Entering the Church: If you are new to the Catholic faith and interested in learning more about the church or about entering the church, welcome! Contact the parish office for a meeting with Father Alfred or Deacon Michael.

Communion to the Homebound: If you or a family member are, or are going to be, homebound, whether at home or in a care facility, please notify the parish office. Medical and care facilities are unable to inform us of their Catholic residents and patients. We would be happy to arrange to visit and bring you Holy Communion. Please contact the parish office for arrangements.

Declarations of Nullity: In some cases, a man or a woman desires healing through a declaration by a Church tribunal (a Catholic Church court), which does not deny that a relationship existed, but simply states that the relationship was missing something that the Church requires for a valid marriage, falling short of at least one of the essential elements required for a binding union. (Commonly called an 'annulment.') Father Alfred, Deacon Michael, and Laura Black are available as Advocates before our diocesan tribunal for those needing assistance with declarations of nullity. Call the parish office to set up an appointment.
