Paul tells the Corinthians to look toward the eternal. In the Gospel, Jesus says that whoever does the will of God is [his] brother and sister and mother.

### Next Sunday: 11th Sunday in Ord. Time

Ez 17:22-24; 2 Cor 5:6-10; Mk 4:26-34
Ezekiel speaks for the Lord God, saying he will plant a majestic cedar on the mountain of Israel. Paul writes that we walk by faith, not by sight, and we must appear before the judgment seat of Christ. In the Gospel, Jesus likens the kingdom of God to a man who scatters seed and harvests it when it is ripe, and also compares the kingdom to a mustard seed that grows into a large plant.

celebrate the sacraments and tell us more about the Diocese of Auchi, Nigeria. Here is a bit of background information that he shared and a photo. Please pray for Father and for this appeal.

The Catholic Diocese of Auchi, Nigeria was erected in November 2003, with Bishop Gabriel Dunia as its first Bishop; situated in the northern part of Edo State and headquartered in Auchi, Nigeria, a predominantly Muslim town. The main economic framework of the area is subsistent farming. The Diocese from the outset had to contend with a lot of challenging factors of development. Viz: The building of a Bishop's house, the Cathedral Church, a pastoral center etc. But what the Diocese lacks in financial strength, it possesses in the abundance of faith and, vocations to the priesthood and religious life.

As of today, the Diocese comprises of 35 parishes, 25 mass centers, 110 priests and 48 seminarians in the three various formative seminaries. The ongoing training of priests and seminarians, consumes the bulk of the financial resources of the diocese.

Sharing our mission story with you is to bring to your awareness the evangelization prospects available in the Diocese and how we hope to spread the word of God in this rural and needful vineyard of Christ. Our quest is to continue evangelization through the facilitation of people-friendly programs of:

A. Healthcare, The provisions of rural



healthcare centers/running a school of midwifery by the diocese.

B. Education, opening of mission schools as the old mission schools were taken over by governments in 1973

C. Training of priests, 48 seminarians in training at this moment takes on a great financial burden on the Diocese, hence the need to solicit for funds, which this missionary cooperative appeal provides to mission territories like ours.

So whatever you are able to contribute to the life and growth of the church is truly given to Christ in need. For it will assist the struggling diocese fulfill some people-friendly programs within its territory and train more priests for the mission of the whole Church.




### RESPECT LIFE MINISTRY

# **HEARING THE WORD:** Mark 3:20-30 **REFLECTING ON THE WORD:**

Jesus' family could not understand his ministry and set out to seize him saying, "He is out of his mind." Maybe we have had similar thoughts about our own family members, or someone in your own family may have judged you without fully understanding. We are not always able to agree with our family, but we can pray for the strength not to judge them or to be frustrated by their judgment of us, and instead to be able to treat one another with respect and with love.

### ON THE WAY TO MASS

Have you ever said you were sorry? At the beginning of Mass we pray about being sorry. Listen for when we pray, "through my fault, through my fault, / through my most grievous fault." In the Confiteor, we acknowledge our failings and ask the saints and our brothers and sisters to pray for us.

### ON THE WAY HOME FROM MASS

What is more difficult: to ask for forgiveness for something you have done, or to forgive someone for what they have done to you?

### LIVING THE WORD

We are Jesus' family, his brothers and sisters. How does he call us to bring peace to our family? How can we practice. and live forgiveness and mercy with one another? Pray the Our Father together and discuss what the prayer tells us about God's forgiveness and how we are called to forgive one another.

**Reconciliation:** In addition to Confessions offered from 3-4 p.m. on Saturdays, you can also schedule an individual time for Reconciliation.

Anointing of the Sick: Appropriate for any upcoming surgery, prolonged illness, or in the event of emergency or danger of death. Please call the office if you or a loved one needs to be anointed.

**Infant & Child Baptism:** For children under the age of 8, please submit the forms at stelizabethgc.org/baptism at least a month before your desired date. For questions or emergencies, please contact the Parish Office

Matrimony: To begin preparation for Holy Matrimony, please contact the parish office to set up initial appointments and preparation at least six months (recommended twelve months) before your desired date. At least an introductory interview must be completed before a date can be set.

Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, first Holy Communion) for children 8 and over, or for adults: Contact the parish office.

#### PASTORAL CARE

**Entering the Church:** If you are new to the Catholic faith and interested in learning more about the church or about entering the church, welcome! Contact the parish office for a meeting with Father Alfred or Deacon Michael.

Communion to the Homebound: If you or a family member are, or are going to be, homebound, whether at home or in a care facility, please notify the parish office. Medical and care facilities are unable to inform us of their Catholic residents and patients. We would be happy to arrange to visit and bring you Holy Communion. Please contact the parish office for arrangements.

Declarations of Nullity: In some cases, a man or a woman desires healing through a declaration by a Church tribunal (a Catholic Church court), which does not deny that a relationship existed, but simply states that the relationship was missing something that the Church requires for a valid marriage, falling short of at least one of the essential elements required for a binding union. (Commonly called an 'annulment.') Advocates are available for those needing assistance with declarations of nullity. Call the parish office to set up an appointment.
