


14 DAY SANCTUARY LAMP

Pope Francis' Prayer Intention for August: For political leaders: Let us pray that political leaders be at the service of their own people, working for integral human development and the common good, taking care of those who have lost their jobs and giving priority to the poor.

This Sunday: 18th Sunday in Ord. Time

Ex 16:2-4, 12-15; Eph 4:17, 20-24; Jn 6:24-35 In the first reading, God feeds his people bread from heaven to sustain them in the desert. Paul exhorts the Ephesians to put on their new selves in Christ. In the Gospel, a few verses after feeding the crowd loaves and fishes, Jesus shares God's offer of true bread that endures for eternal life, that is, Jesus himself.

Next Sunday: 19th Sunday in Ord. Time 1 Kgs 19:4-8; Eph 4:30-5:2; Jn 6:41-51
Elijah prays for death but is instead awakened by an angel of the Lord who commands him to eat and drink before traveling to the Lord's mountain, Horeb. Paul exhorts the Ephesians to imitate God and treat each other lovingly. Jesus responds to the murmurings of the crowd reaffirming his claim that he is the living bread, come down from

HEARING THE WORD: John 6:26-35

REFLECTING ON THE WORD:

When we receive Christ in the Eucharist, we are strengthened by his life inside us. In today's Gospel, the people are searching for Jesus and are wanting to see signs confirming that Jesus is the one sent by God. Jesus tells the people that he is the bread sent by God. If they believe and follow Jesus, they will never be hungry again. For what do you hunger? How does the Eucharist we receive at Mass feed you throughout the week?

ON THE WAY TO MASS

At every Mass, we pray the Our Father. We ask God to "give us this day our daily bread." Is this only about food? What else do we need every day?

ON THE WAY HOME FROM MASS

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us that he is the Bread of Life. He is not just bread for today, but for life. What could that mean for us?

LIVING THE WORD

Jesus tells the people that he is the Bread of Life. The people in the Gospel followed him because they thought he could give them the bread they needed to fill their stomachs; they did not understand that he would provide nourishment for their spiritual hunger. Discuss how Jesus satisfies the hungers of our hearts, and how we could not survive if we do not remain with him. Pray the Our Father as a family. Make a prayer card with the words "Give us this day our daily bread."

WEEKLY STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

"Each day the people are to go out and gather their daily portion; thus, will I test them, to see whether they follow my instructions or not." - Exodus 16:4

When the Israelites gathered more than their daily portion of manna, the surplus became wormy and rotten. In the same way today, self-reliance, pride and ego lead to hoarding and excessive surplus of goods and money. Living a Stewardship lifestyle helps us discern our "wants" from our "needs". Living a grateful and generous lifestyle reminds us that God will provide all that we need and that we have plenty to share

SACRAMENTS

Reconciliation: In addition to Confessions offered from 3-4 p.m. on Saturdays, you can also schedule an individual time for Reconciliation.

Anointing of the Sick: Appropriate for any upcoming surgery, prolonged illness, or in the event of emergency or danger of death. Please call the office if you or a loved one needs to be anointed.

Infant & Child Baptism: For children under the age of 8, please submit the forms at stelizabethgc.org/baptism at least a month before your desired date. For questions or emergencies, please contact the Parish Office

Matrimony: To begin preparation for Holy Matrimony, please contact the parish office to set up initial appointments and preparation at least six months (recommended twelve months) before your desired date. At least an introductory interview must be completed before a date can be set.

Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, first Holy Communion) for children 8 and over, or for adults: Contact the parish office.

PASTORAL CARE

Entering the Church: If you are new to the Catholic faith and interested in learning more about the church or about entering the church, welcome! Contact the parish office for a meeting with Father Alfred or Deacon Michael.

Communion to the Homebound: If you or a family member are, or are going to be, homebound, whether at home or in a care facility, please notify the parish office. Medical and care facilities are unable to inform us of their Catholic residents and patients. We would be happy to arrange to visit and bring you Holy Communion. Please contact the parish office for arrangements.

Declarations of Nullity: In some cases, a man or a woman desires healing through a declaration by a Church tribunal (a Catholic Church court), which does not deny that a relationship existed, but simply states that the relationship was missing something that the Church requires for a valid marriage, falling short of at least one of the essential elements required for a binding union. (Commonly called an 'annulment.') Advocates are available for those needing assistance with declarations of nullity. Call the parish office to set up an appointment.
