St. Elizabeth School Policy for: Fix & Returns

The process of fixing and returning homework plays a crucial role in helping students identify and correct their mistakes, strengthen their understanding, and develop a sense of responsibility and accountability toward their learning.

From this point forward, NO TESTS will qualify for fix and returns. Each teacher has their own policy in regard to homework in different subject areas. Math fix and redo's are allowed with any earned grade. Students are able to fix any and all math homework to earn a better grade. Other subject areas are up to the teacher's discretion.

Be there to guide and mentor, but let your child put in the effort themselves. Encourage your child to solve problems on their own with your help, not by doing it for them.

Per the Springfield Diocese, the following policy was to be implemented. Our handbook has been updated and beginning in January the office will no longer be able to administer over the counter meds by calling parents. Please plan according.

Non-Prescription Medication

- 1. Non-prescription medications, including aspirin, antacid, antihistamine, and other medications should have a label with orders from your physician.
- 2.Children are required to turn in all medications to the office with signed parental permission which also specifies dosage, strength and time.
- 3.If injury occurs, we will use soap and water, ice pack or Band-Aid and inform the parent if the child needs further treatment or needs to be sent home.
- 4.If the child needs medication, the parent will be called and must assume the responsibility to bring the child medication or take the child home.
