In the second reading, Paul instructs the community on how to conduct themselves as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved. In the Gospel, Jesus stayed behind in Jerusalem as Mary and Joseph made their way home. They found him in the temple, and he said: Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?

Next Sunday: The Epiphany of the Lord

Is 60:1-6; Eph 3:2-3a, 5-6; Mt 2:1-12 Isaiah calls Jerusalem to rise up in splendor, for their light has come ... Nations shall walk by [it] and all shall gather and [proclaim] the praises of the Lord. Paul writes to the Ephesians that it has now been revealed ... by the Spirit: that the Gentiles are coheirs, members of the same body, and copartners in the promise in Christ. In the Gospel, the Magi arrive in Jerusalem seeking the newborn king of the Jews. They follow a star to where he lay, bringing him gifts and paying him homage.

From our Pastor Father Alfred

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ!

"Gloria in excelsis Deo" (Latin for "Glory to God in the highest")!

We break the silence of the penitential season of preparation (Advent), and we join the Angelic Choir to sing what the Angels sang the night our dear Lord and Savior Jesus Christ was born in Bethlehem. And the Shepherds heard them sing and never forgot it, we too may we never forget it even after "the 12 days from Christmas" are over until we sing it along with the angels in Heaven. Let us praise God saying: "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of goodwill." (Luke 2:14). It is a time of rejoicing! Merry Christmas!

Meanwhile it is in this season of rejoicing that I fulfil my canonical obligation to have a month of vacation (Can. 533 §2; §3), during which time I take the long trip half-way the world to Uganda (21 hours, 40 minutes – flight duration), not only to visit my family and friends but also to have time for relaxation and physical refreshment that Canon Law gives clerics. This being a single priest parish, to make sure that the spiritual needs of the faithful here at St. Elizabeth Parish are taken care of during my absence, with permission and recommendation from the diocese, Reverend Father Sylvanus Mushabe, will be my substitute priest covering the Sacramental Ministry for the period of 5 weeks I am gone.

Reverend Father Sylvanus Mushabe, (43 years old), was born in Bigodi village, Kamwenge district to Mr. Deziderio Kalemire (RIP) and Mrs. Veneranda K. Tibanagwa. He is the 7th of Nine (9) children, 3 girls and 6 boys. He was ordained a Deacon on July 14, 2012, at Virika Cathedral and a Priest on July 20, 2013, at Kahunge Parish for Fort Portal Catholic Diocese in Western Uganda, by the Rt. Rev. Robert Muhiirwa, Bishop of Fort Portal. Father Mushabe is a professional teacher of Religion and Entrepreneurship, with a Master's in Education Policy, Planning and Management, from Kyambogo University, Uganda. Currently, he works as a Parochial Vicar at Saint Micheal Catholic Church, Kahunge, in Kamwenge district, while serving as the Youth and Schools' Chaplain in the same parish.

Please welcome Reverend Father Sylvanus Mushabe, and avail him the utmost hospitality, this being his first time to experience a snow season. Thank you, Father Sylvanus, for your availability to share your priestly ministry and gifts with us.

Lastly, on Tuesday, December 17, 2024, Bishop Thomas John Paprocki, issued a De-

cree of Conclusion of the appointment of, the Reverence George Chukwunwendu Okoli, as Parochial Vicar of St. Elizabeth Parish, Granite City, Illinois due to inability to make a passage to the United States. It is unfortunate that the immigration delays have prevented Fr. Okoli from his assignment at Saint Elizabeth Parish, and our excitement to meet him in person. We continue to pray for him and his priestly ministry.

HEARING THE WORD: Luke 2:41-50

REFLECTING ON THE WORD:

Once, while trying to make a stressful decision involving my kids - one of those times when no option seems satisfactory, and outcomes are out of your hands - I was gently reminded in the context of prayer that "our children are not our own." I think we know. rationally. that this is true. We see it whenever our children exercise their free will, grow personalities different from ours or, most painfully of all, experience suffering. I wonder how Mary and Joseph felt about this before, during, and after losing Jesus in Jerusalem. Knowing children don't belong to you doesn't mean your heart is not entwined with theirs. There's a reason this story is considered one of Mary's Seven Sorrows! Like Mary and Joseph, we hope to find our children in the Father's house. We set them on their way the day they were baptized, and we journey with them, pilgrims together.

ON THE WAY TO MASS

Have you ever been lost, or afraid of getting lost? How did it make you feel?

ON THE WAY HOME FROM MASS

How do you think Mary and Joseph felt when they couldn't find Jesus? Did Jesus seem scared? I wonder why?

LIVING THE WORD

Find a way to practice being pilgrims as a family: visit a different parish for Mass or a few minutes of prayer or light a candle in front of sacred art you normally walk by.

During this season of giving, let us remember a beautiful gift that we have received – being children of God! As God's children, it's in our DNA that we share and express our love for others as well. Tell your spouse, children, other family members and friends that you love them, every day! Also, pray for those people that are different than you, those that you may not like or those that go out of their way to annoy you. Your prayers may be the start of a new friendship.

SACRAMENTS

Reconciliation: In addition to Confessions offered from 3-4 p.m. on Saturdays, you can also schedule an individual time for Reconciliation.

Anointing of the Sick: Appropriate for any upcoming surgery, prolonged illness, or in the event of emergency or danger of death. Please call the office if you or a loved one needs to be anointed.

Infant & Child Baptism: For children under the age of 8, please submit the forms at stelizabethgc.org/baptism at least a month before your desired date. For questions or emergencies, please contact the Parish Office.

Matrimony: To begin preparation for Holy Matrimony, please contact the parish office to set up initial appointments and preparation at least six months (recommended twelve months) before your desired date. At least an introductory interview must be completed before a date can be set.

Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, first Holy Communion) for children 8 and over, or for adults: Contact the parish office.

PASTORAL CARE

Entering the Church: If you are new to the Catholic faith and interested in learning more about the church or about entering the church, welcome! Contact the parish office for a meeting with Father Alfred or Deacon Michael.

Communion to the Homebound: If you or a family member are, or are going to be, homebound, whether at home or in a care facility, please notify the parish office. Medical and care facilities are unable to inform us of their Catholic residents and patients. We would be happy to arrange to visit and bring you Holy Communion. Please contact the parish office for arrangements.

Declarations of Nullity: In some cases, a man or a woman desires healing through a declaration by a Church tribunal (a Catholic Church court), which does not deny that a relationship existed, but simply states that the relationship was missing something that the Church requires for a valid marriage, falling short of at least one of the essential elements required for a binding union. (Commonly called an 'annulment.') Advocates are available for those needing assistance with declarations of nullity. Call the parish office to set up an appointment.
