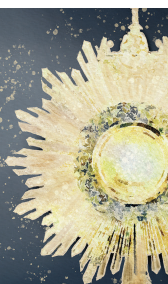

Pope Francis' Prayer Intention for January:

For the right to an education: Let us pray for migrants, refugees, and those affected by war, that their right to an education, which is necessary to build a better world, might always be respected.

This Sunday: The Baptism of the Lord

Is 42:1-4, 6-7; Acts 10:34-38; Lk 3:15-16, 21-22

In today's first reading, the prophet Isaiah declares that God's servant will be a light for the nations and will bring forth justice for all. Peter, in the second reading, declares that God anointed Jesus with the Holy Spirit and power. In the Gospel, John announces one mightier than himself coming and baptizes Jesus. When Jesus is baptized, the Holy Spirit descends upon him.

Next Sunday: 2nd Sunday in Ord. Time

Is 62:1-5; 1 Cor 12:4-11; Jn 2:1-11

In the first reading, Isaiah speaks of God's care for Zion, and his promise of restoration and rejoicing. Zion will be like a cherished bride. In the second reading, Paul writes of the same Spirit producing different individual gifts. In the Gospel, Jesus attends a wedding feast at Cana and the wine [runs] short. He instructs the servers to fill jars with water, and when the water is drawn out to be tasted, it had become wine.

'He Loved Us': Pope Francis' new encyclical on the Sacred Heart of Jesus

"Dilexit nos," Pope Francis' fourth Encyclical, retraces the tradition and relevance of thought on "the human and divine love of the heart of Jesus Christ," calling for a renewal of authentic devotion to avoid forgetting the tenderness of faith, the joy of serving, and the fervour of mission.

"'He loved us', Saint Paul says of Christ (cf. Rom 8:37), in order to make us realize that nothing can ever 'separate us' from that love (Rom 8:39)": Thus begins Pope Francis' fourth Encyclical, which takes its title from the opening words, *Dilexit nos*.

The Encyclical is dedicated to the human and divine love of the Heart of Jesus Christ: "His open heart has gone before us and waits for us, unconditionally, asking only to offer us His love and friendship," the Pope writes in the introductory paragraph. "For 'He loved us first' (cf. 1 Jn 4:10). Because of Jesus, 'we have come to know and believe in the love that God has for us' (1 Jn 4:16)."

The love of Christ represented in His Sacred Heart

In our societies, the Pope writes, "we are also seeing a proliferation of varied forms of religiosity that have nothing to do with a personal relationship with the God of love" (87), while Christianity often forgets "the tender consolations of faith, the joy of serving others, the fervour of personal commitment to mission" (88).

In response, Pope Francis proposes a new reflection on the love of Christ represented in His Holy Heart. He calls for a renewal of "authentic devotion" (163) to the Sacred Heart, recalling that in the Heart of Christ "we find the whole Gospel" (89). It is in His Heart that "we truly come at last to know ourselves and we learn to love" (30).

This was impossible in my little head and heart. I gained exceptional courage to overcome fear of the unknown. It's my first time to see snow. Fr. Alfred told me to explore. It's worth it. I'm grateful. First time to see snow. I'm an achiever. I have seen snow. I have touched snow. I am not afraid of snow. Thank you everyone for the support.

HEARING THE WORD:

Luke 3:15-16, 21-22

REFLECTING ON THE WORD:

Baptism is the most decisive moment in the life of every Christian. It's the moment our identity is rooted in Christ, the moment our original sin and our separation from God is vanquished, and the moment when we are adopted into the family of God. As a catechist, when I teach preschoolers about their baptism, I come down to their eye level, place a lit candle between their hands and, addressing them by name, say, "You have received the light of Christ." They receive this with wide eyes and solemnity-it is fire, after all-and I wonder if we adults ever ponder the gravity of this fact in the same way. Do we think of ourselves as bearers of Christ's light? Do we really believe his life (and the power that resurrected him from death) animates our own? Do we see ourselves as sons and daughters of God?

ON THE WAY TO MASS

What kind of identities would you use to describe yourself: A girl? A son? A student? A soccer player? Which is most important to you?

ON THE WAY HOME FROM MASS

How should we live if we're beloved sons and daughters of God? How should we treat each other?

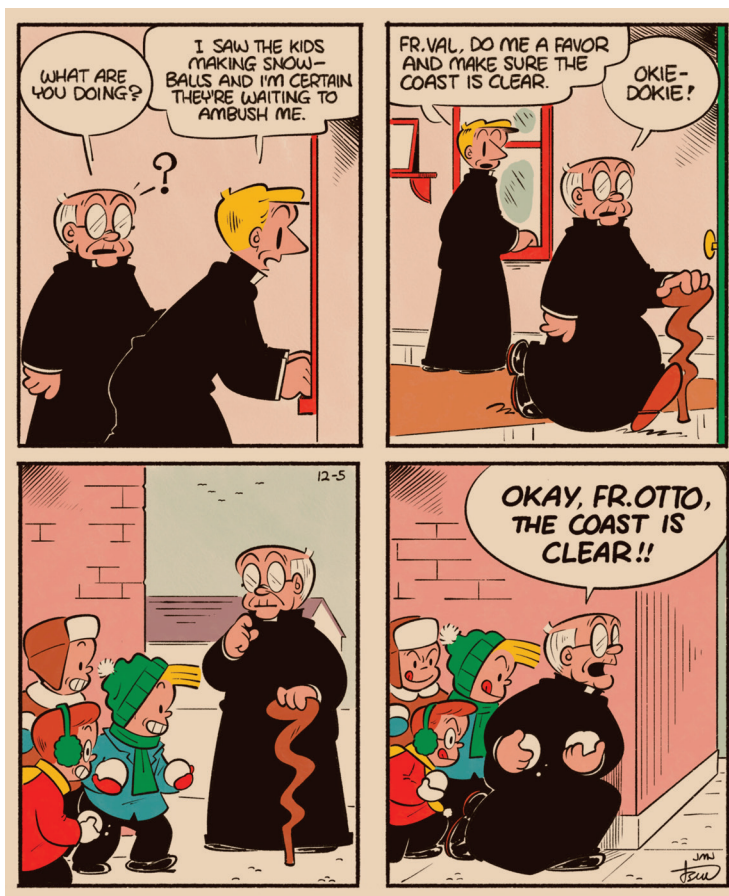

WEEKLY STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

“John answered them all, ‘I baptize you with water; but he who is mightier than I is coming...he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit...” - Luke 3:16

The Catholic Catechism states that “Jesus’ immersion in the water is a sign for all human beings of the need to die to themselves to do God’s will.” In other words, as baptized Catholics there is only one gift that we need to give to Jesus – the gift of ourselves. Surrender yourself to God, place your trust in Him and allow the Holy Spirit to work through you for the greater glory of God.

SACRAMENTS

Reconciliation: In addition to Confessions offered from 3-4 p.m. on Saturdays, you can also schedule an individual time for Reconciliation.

Anointing of the Sick: Appropriate for any upcoming surgery, prolonged illness, or in the event of emergency or danger of death. Please call the office if you or a loved one needs to be anointed.

Infant & Child Baptism: For children under the age of 8, please submit the forms at stelizabethgc.org/baptism at least a month before your desired date. For questions or emergencies, please contact the Parish Office.

Matrimony: To begin preparation for Holy Matrimony, please contact the parish office to set up initial appointments and preparation at least six months (recommended twelve months) before your desired date. At least an introductory interview must be completed before a date can be set.

Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, first Holy Communion) for children 8 and over, or for adults: Contact the parish office.

PASTORAL CARE

Entering the Church: If you are new to the Catholic faith and interested in learning more about the church or about entering the church, welcome! Contact the parish office for a meeting with Father Alfred or Deacon Michael.

Communion to the Homebound: If you or a family member are, or are going to be, homebound, whether at home or in a care facility, please notify the parish office. Medical and care facilities are unable to inform us of their Catholic residents and patients. We would be happy to arrange to visit and bring you Holy Communion. Please contact the parish office for arrangements.

Declarations of Nullity: In some cases, a man or a woman desires healing through a declaration by a Church tribunal (a Catholic Church court), which does not deny that a relationship existed, but simply states that the relationship was missing something that the Church requires for a valid marriage, falling short of at least one of the essential elements required for a binding union. (Commonly called an ‘annulment.’) Advocates are available for those needing assistance with declarations of nullity. Call the parish office to set up an appointment.
