## From our Pastor Father Alfred

PRAISED BE JESUS CHRIST (LAUDETUR JESUS CHRISTUS)! Bishop Robert Barron in his little book, "What Christians Believe - Understanding the Nicene Creed" writes: "The resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead is the fulcrum on which all of the Christian Faith *turns.*" This weekend we come to the celebration of the greatest and the most important feast in the Church - EASTER. This is a feast which gives us hope and encouragement in this world of pain, sorrows, tears, evil habits, dangerous addictions, despair, discouragement or doubts, and the surrounding death culture (wars, abortion, death penalty etc.) Easter feast is a beautiful reminder that life is worth living. It drives off unnecessary worries and fears. It is a time to remember whenever we are greatly troubled like Jesus was in his passion, and death, to say to ourselves and to the world around us that "Now is the Son of Man glorified, and God is glorified in him..." (John 13:31).

As St. Paul writes: "If Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain; and your Faith is in vain" (I Cor 15:14). Knowing that "Jesus is Lord!, He is risen!" (Rom 10:9), makes us credible intentional disciples and stewards of the risen Jesus, and forms the basis for our Christian witness as it was the central theme of the keryama (or "preaching"), of the Apostles. Here at Saint Elizabeth Parish and School, let our faith not be futile but be renewed by our belief in the Real Presence of the Risen Jesus in and around us, in His Church, in the Blessed Sacrament, and in Heaven - "an indication of what we can all hope for". I therefore want to wish you a joyful Easter season as you continue to live a joyful and peaceful life, constantly experiencing the living presence of the Risen Lord, who is good and loves us in all the events of our lives. May we all continue to radiate the loving presence of the Risen Lord in our lives wherever we are, and to all those we encounter.

## This Sunday: Easter Sunday

Acts 10:34a, 37-43; Col 3:1-4; 1 Cor 5:6b-8
In the first reading, Peter speaks about Jesus' ministry, death, and resurrection. He recounts his appearances to chosen witnesses, whom he commissioned to preach in his name. Paul urges the Colossians to focus on what is heavenly. In the Gospel, Mary Magdalene discovers the tomb empty and tells Simon Peter and another disciple who run to the tomb and see the burial cloths.

**Next Sunday: Divine Mercy Sunday** 

Acts 5:12-16; Rev 1:9-11a, 12-13, 17-19; Jn 20:19-31 In the first reading, the Apostles performed many signs and wonders. Many who were sick came to them and they were all cured. In the second reading, John describes a vision he had on the island of Patmos. It was of the risen Christ, who declares himself alive forever. In the Gospel, the resurrected Jesus appears to the disciples. He invites Thomas to touch his wounds and believe.

### **Good Friday Fast Reminder**

Those ages 18-59, in reasonable health, are required to fast on Good Friday. Those 14 and older must abstain from meat. Children, adults with physical and mental illness, pregnant women and those nursing are all exempt. The USCCB stresses that "common sense should prevail" and that no one should jeopardize their health to fast. Canon Law does mention that for young children not fasting, parents should still communicate the meaning and penance.

Lent ends at the beginning of the Triduum (Evening Mass on Holy Thursday), but Lenten fasting and personal commitments usually continue until Easter. Papal document *Paschalis Solemnitatis* recommends this in order that we "with uplifted and welcoming heart be ready to celebrate the joys of the Sunday of the resurrection."

### DIVINE MERCY NOVENA

The Divine Mercy Novena begins on Good Friday, April 18, and ends on April 27, the Second Sunday of Easter. In the message to St. Faustina, Our Lord requested that the first Sunday after Easter be the Feast of Mercy. On April 30, 2000, Pope John Paul II declared that the Second Sunday of Easter would be celebrated as Divine Mercy Sunday through the whole Church. On that same day he canonized Sister Faustina as the first "Saint of the Jubilee Year of Mercy." After completing the Novena in 2005, Pope John Paul II died on the eve of Mercy Sunday. He was beatified on Mercy Sunday in 2011 by Pope Benedict XVI and canonized by Pope Francis on April 27, 2014.



Pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet with us through the Novena, starting just after the Good Friday 3:00 p.m. liturgy, each day at 3:00 p.m. (at the church, or where you are), ending in the church at 3:00 p.m. on Divine Mercy Sunday, after a Holy Hour from 2-3 p.m. that day.

"Our Lord spoke these words to St. Faustina, 'My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the Fount of My Mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day all the divine floodgates through which graces flow are opened."" (Diary, 699)

## FIRST FRIDAY MEMORIALS - MAY 2025 to APRIL 2026 It's Time to Sign-up for Our First Friday Memorials

The First Friday Memorial is a special offering made by parishioners of St. Elizabeth Parish, which lists your intentions for deceased loved ones in our bulletin, and these listed names are then remembered monthly at Mass each First Friday throughout the entire year. The Memorial names are printed each week in our Sunday Bulletin. A yearly donation of \$60.00 is requested for these intentions to be listed.

This donation allows the names to be printed constantly in our bulletin, in the exact same way other bulletin ads are funded, and all the funds go to offset the cost of printing our bulletin. This is not a donation for a Mass intention since the money does not, and by Canon Law cannot, go into the Mass stipend account, as taking any money for large, so-called "collective intentions" (where multiple names are listed for the Mass intention) is explicitly forbidden. Father is happy to remember these names collectively once a month at Mass with no stipend involved. Your donation is a publishing/printing fee, ultimately paid to our printer in Godfrey, Illinois.

You are encouraged to attend this weekday Mass. You may list your intentions as one individual name: Mary Jones, or you may list family groupings: The Jones Family. You may NOT submit a litany of individual names or multiple families, as space will not permit. If you wish to continue having your past intentions remembered at these Masses, you will be asked to renew your donation each year. Please fill out this form below and return it to the Parish Office as soon as possible with the requested donation.

## **HEARING THE WORD:**

Luke 19:36-40

### **REFLECTING ON THE WORD:**

Place yourself in the position of the first, early-morning witnesses of Jesus' empty tomb. I imagine a mix of curiosity, anxiety, and fear coursing through their minds as they wait outside. Mary, only seeing the stone out of place before she runs and gets the others; John, bending down at the entrance and peering into the dark. Then Peter - brash, presumptuous Peter barrels in and looks upon the empty burial cloths of the Lord, the friend, he'd just denied. I wonder if that memory is part of what compels Peter to go inside. Mary and John had stayed with Jesus at the foot of the cross until he died. Where had Peter been? It was night when the cock crowed; now he plunges into another darkness, unsure of what he'll find. Jesus' resurrection beck- ons us even - especially - in our deepest moments of shame and fear. Will we answer?





### **UPCOMING SPECIAL & SECOND COLLECTIONS**

April 20: Seminarians (Easter Sunday) – This collection helps form and educate the future priests of the diocese. In partnership with generous benefactors in the Good Shephard Society, your gift will secure financial support for these young men on their discernment journey.

May 4: Catholic Home Missions (3rd Sunday of Easter) – Funds from this appeal, approved by the USCCB in 1997, help expand and strengthen the presence of the Church in the United States and its dependencies through the support of basic pastoral services in areas struggling to provide such necessities on their own. The appeal allows Catholics to help support local communities where Catholics are few, the Church is fragile, and pastors struggle to keep mission parishes afloat.

May 25: Catholic Communication Campaign (6th Sunday of Easter) – The essential mission of the CCC is contribute to the process of evangelization by fostering activities in relation to television, radio, and other media, and through special projects of the Catholic press. 50% of this collection is sent to the national office and 50% is retained in the diocese for use in local communication projects. From the national office portion, grants are made following recommendations by the USCCB Communications Committee.

## WEEKLY STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

## "He went about doing good and healing all those oppressed by the devil, for God was with him." - Acts 10:38

As God's adopted sons and daughters, we are made in His image and likeness. As Pope Benedict XVI says, "we are made for greatness." Let our lives reflect His light to others. ### **SACRAMENTS**

**Reconciliation:** In addition to Confessions offered from 3-4 p.m. on Saturdays, you can also schedule an individual time for Reconciliation.

Anointing of the Sick: Appropriate for any upcoming surgery, prolonged illness, or in the event of emergency or danger of death. Please call the office if you or a loved one needs to be anointed.

**Infant & Child Baptism:** For children under the age of 8, please submit the forms at stelizabethgc.org/baptism at least a month before your desired date. For questions or emergencies, please contact the Parish Office.

Matrimony: To begin preparation for Holy Matrimony, please contact the parish office to set up initial appointments and preparation at least six months (recommended twelve months) before your desired date. At least an introductory interview must be completed before a date can be set.

Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, first Holy Communion) for children 8 and over, or for adults: Contact the parish office.

#### PASTORAL CARE

Entering the Church: If you are new to the Catholic faith and interested in learning more about the church or about entering the church, welcome! Contact the parish office for a meeting with Father Alfred or Deacon Michael.

Communion to the Homebound: If you or a family member are, or are going to be, homebound, whether at home or in a care facility, please notify the parish office. Medical and care facilities are unable to inform us of their Catholic residents and patients. We would be happy to arrange to visit and bring you Holy Communion. Please contact the parish office for arrangements.

Declarations of Nullity: In some cases, a man or a woman desires healing through a declaration by a Church tribunal (a Catholic Church court), which does not deny that a relationship existed, but simply states that the relationship was missing something that the Church requires for a valid marriage, falling short of at least one of the essential elements required for a binding union. (Commonly called an 'annulment.') Advocates are available for those needing assistance with declarations of nullity. Call the parish office to set up an appointment.
