### Lord, Teach Us To Pray

The gospel of Luke this week offers profound insights into prayer, beginning with the disciples' request for Jesus to teach them how to pray. Jesus responds with the Lord's Prayer, a model of humble petition and reliance on God for daily needs, forgiveness, and deliverance from evil. He then emphasizes persistence in prayer through the parable of the persistent friend, assuring us that even a reluctant neighbor will respond to tireless knocking. Finally, Jesus offers the comforting promise that if earthly fathers give good gifts to their children, how much more will our heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask.



# 2025 Picnic Update



Hello Everyone,

Hope this letter finds you all well and enjoying your summer vacations, family time and relaxation. I just wanted to share feedback about our picnic fundraiser campaign from this year.

These are things we introduced this year; Sowing the Seeds of God's Kingdom Tent, Raffle Booth, New Beer Vendor, Chili & Cheese Hot Dog, 2025 Picnic Ferris Wheel Cookie, New Kids' Games, VIP Band Seating, and a New Ordering System. All innovations were great opportunities for revenue, profit, accountability, and spiritual growth moving forward. I'm always looking for new ways to improve our picnic each year, so please feel free to send me any of your ideas @ tcdomo@charter.net.

We had a mixed genre of music entertainment this year from Swing, Yacht, Mexican, Voices, Local Cover Band with special guest Fr. Alfred on vocals/tambourine. If you did not come out and enjoy your favorite band or special guest, you missed an opportunity to listen to notable talent.

My experience of the last two years of how weather affects our picnic has been a little challenging. In 2024, hot and dry weather led to increased sales of cold refreshments and fewer food items. In 2025, cooler and rainy weather led to higher food sales, but fewer cold refreshments sold. With that said, our food category did better in 2025 than 2024 while our drink category showed a decrease in sales. Overall, our picnic was down about 35k in gross revenue from last year due to the rain on Friday and Saturday. The band on Friday was able to play the entire evening which held the crowd with us throughout the evening. But unfortunately, on Saturday night, our biggest day, the story was different when the band had to take down their equipment 2 hours early because of rain entering the stage and causing safety issues for our musicians. The big crowd left with them. I want to personally thank all the "chairmen and volunteers" who stuck it out in the rain and continued to serve the die hard community that hung in there with us.

Our bottom line is better than I thought it was going to be based on our sloppy weather. But I can safely say that we will profit over \$100K again this year. I should have an exact figure within a couple of weeks to publish in an upcoming bulletin. We have not received all submissions yet.

I am also happy to announce that I had the opportunity to sign another three (3) year contract with our current ride operator, Fun-Time Shows. This means, as a parish family and team, we have another three-year commitment of planning to continue our parish picnic and carnival. I am sure there is speculation and concern for me continuing my leadership role as the general chairperson of our picnic. I am happy to say confirm that I will continue to lead this wonderful team of parishioners as your picnic chairperson and to fulfill this 3-year contract.

I would like to remind everyone that our "Appreciation Picnic & Pool Party" for all team volunteers and parishioners will be on Thursday, July 31st at Wilson Park at Pavilion #5 from 5p-10p. (private pool session, 7p-9p). Pavilion #5 is located behind the Ice Rink, and you may enter by Old Niedringhaus school on 29th Street. We will be serving Sloppy Joe's, hot dogs, chili/cheese nachos, potato salad, baked beans, chips, cupcakes, cookies, water, and soda. Remember that Wilson Park is a "no alcohol" permitted property.

Thank you all for your commitment, support, and prayers for our ongoing efforts to make this parish fundraiser successful each year!


