## Ut unum sint- 'That They May Be One'

The historic meeting this week between King Charles III, the Supreme Governor of the Church of England, and Pope Leo XIV marked a momentous step in ecumenical relations, as they prayed together publicly in the Sistine Chapel for the first time between a reigning British monarch and a pontiff since the Reformation. Following their private audience and the joint service, the King was conferred the title of "Royal Confrater" at the Papal Basilica of St. Paul Outside the Walls, a gesture of spiritual fellowship. For this occasion, a special chair was created for the King and his successors, which bears his coat of arms and the profound Latin inscription: "Ut unum sint"—meaning "That they may be one." The phrase comes directly from the Gospel of John, specifically John 17:21. It is part of Jesus's High Priestly Prayer, where he prays to the Father for his disciples (and all who will believe in him) to be united.

### ALL SAINTS/ALL SOULS/DAY OF THE DEAD/DIA DE LOS MUERTOS

Next weekend we celebrate, remember and pray for the saints who have gone before us as well as all of our dearly departed. This year we hope to incorporate more fully the Hispanic tradition of Dia de Los Muertos. The multi-day holiday involves family and friends gathering to pay respects and remember friends and family members who have died. These celebrations can take a humorous tone, as celebrants remember amusing events and anecdotes about the departed. It is widely observed in Mexico, where it largely developed, and is also observed in other places, especially by people of Mexican heritage.

Beginning Monday there will be an altar in the gathering space to join the one that is already in the school. Tradition holds that you can place photos, mementos or other remembrances for your family and friends who are no longer with us physically. In addition, these are the traditional items placed on the altar during this time:

October 27: Pets arrive

October 28: The first candle and a white flower are placed to welcome the souls who died alone.

October 29: Another candle and a glass of water are added for the forgotten and helpless souls.

October 30: A new candle, water, and white bread are placed for those who passed suddenly or without food.

November 1: All Saints' Day — dedicated to the souls of children. November 2: All Souls' Day — for the souls of adults.

In addition, there will be a special Spanish Mass on Sunday, November 2 at 12:30 p.m. Members of our community will be preparing and offering ethic food dishes in the Harmony Room after this Mass. We hope to see as many of you as are able, joining us!


