PRAY THE ROSARY ALL MONTH

October is traditionally celebrated by Catholics as the Month of the Holy Rosary, a devotion that gained particular prominence in part due to the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary on October 7th. A powerful advocate for this Marian prayer was Pope Saint John Paul II, who often emphasized its spiritual significance and called it his "favorite prayer," describing it as a "compendium of the Gospel." Recognizing the Rosary's profound ability to lead the faithful into contemplation of the face of Christ with Mary, the Holy Father urged all Catholics to rediscover and pray the Rosary daily throughout the month, seeing it as a vital tool for personal holiness, peace in families, and the salvation of the world.


