These upgrades are essential to ensure safer, smoother access for all visitors, and to better serve families for years to come.



# Serving whose who Serve



ear Father,

Allow me to express my profound gratitude to you and your parish community for participating in the upcoming National Collection for the Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA (AMS).

As you know, the collection is approved by the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops to be taken every three years, to increase awareness and support of the mission, "Serving Those Who Serve."

The ministries offered by the AMS benefit those who serve in all six branches of the U.S. Armed Forces, Veterans, and their families.

The mission of this Archdiocese is to ensure that service members, Veterans, and their families be able to seek sacramental preparation for baptism, confirmation, first Communion, penance, and marriage; to benefit from consultation with a priest, and to receive the sacrament of penance as they defend our rights of freedom and speech, and face constant transition and uncertainty.

In addition, the AMS Co-Sponsored Seminarian Program is the only vocations program in the United States that provides priests to serve as military chaplains and also to serve in parishes and dioceses across the country that struggle with their own critical shortage of ministers. When the priest separates from the military, he then returns to his diocese or community.

Please help me continue to provide for those entrusted to my pastoral care – including those who originate from your own parish or diocese - by including one or more bulletin announcements in your weekly publication, making collection envelopes readily available, and perhaps consider having an active-duty or retired military member of your parish offer a witness regarding his or her experience of receiving the sacraments or counsel from an AMS endorsed priest while serving on active-duty.

Please pray for an increase in vocations to the priesthood and religious life. Know that your intentions will be remembered at the altar.


