This weekend marks the kickoff of the St. Elizabeth Parish 2025-2028 Capital Campaign. The Campaign is a recognition of our Parish's many needs for updating the Campus, maintaining the infrastructure, and growing as a relevant part of the Granite City area community. It is also a request from the Springfield Diocese for ALL 129 parishes to mark the 100th anniversary celebration in 2028 of the Cathedral in Springfield, and to do so by undertaking capital campaigns that will strengthen our collective Catholic impact on our State and our Country. Some parishes have already completed their fundraising and are beginning construction of their improvement projects. Our fundraising campaign is just beginning and will conclude on the Feast of St. Elizabeth (November 17) in 2028.

Our overall campaign goal is lofty: \$2.1 million (\$700,000 / year for three years) and is comprised of many of the projects identified in parishioner surveys, discussions with the Maintenance Team, ideas heard at Harmony Café, and conversations amongst all of you. -----over------

While we would love to be raising funds for new construction and/or replacement of old facilities, our focus in this campaign is to use the funds for much-needed infrastructure and safety improvements while refreshing the public areas of the Campus and buildings. Our School, Parish Life Center, Gym and Cafeteria are 70 years old this year! Our new Church is now 23 years old...already.

The Campaign projects include (listed in descending order of cost)

- Remainder of School roof replacement
- Church or Harmony Room roof replacement
- Repair and re-seal the gym parking lot and entrance
- Stained glass in the Church
- Interior and exterior painting (light posts, sign posts, doors, Gathering Space, School) and landscaping
- Community Support and Outreach
- Security and Communication Upgrades across the Campus
- Church Heating and Air Conditioning
- Springfield Diocese support for refurbishment of the Cathedral

An entire committee of your fellow parishioners has been formed to communicate and track progress in meeting the goal, follow up on pledges, brainstorm and implement new community-wide fundraisers, and complete the projects. Our commitment to you is that we will not wait three years in order to begin the projects, but rather will undertake them individually as soon as the funds are available so that you can see progress happening throughout the campaign.

The Campaign Committee will host Harmony Café after all Masses next weekend. Please bring any questions that you have regarding the campaign, the projects it will fund, thoughts on new community fundraisers, and any other items associated with the Campaign.

The Committee has thoughtfully decided NOT to hire a fundraising firm, but rather undertake this effort within our Parish so that more of the funds would stay here. When we meet our goal, greater than 96% of the funds raised will directly support our projects. Less than 4% will be sent to the Diocese to support refurbishment of the nearly 100-year-old Cathedral.

We ask that YOU prayerfully consider making a sacrificial, three-year commitment to our parish. This new campaign request is above and beyond your normal giving levels. If you are not yet to a point of tithing (10% of your gross income) to the Church annually, please use this as an opportunity to make a step toward that.

Above all, please pray. Pray for the success of our Parish, our school, our parishioners and our capital campaign, and in so doing, thank God for all He has given us and for blessing us so abundantly. Please direct questions or feedback to us via email at volunteers@stelizabethgc.org.

Several weeks ago, Deacon Michael put out a challenge to have 500 hours of adoration to the Blessed Sacrament before Thanksgiving. Wouldn't it be wonderful to see the Church flooded every Thursday and Sunday from 7-8 p.m. in Adoration as we prayerfully consider our Campaign need?




