The Beginning of His Mission

This week, we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, a powerful moment that marks the transition from Jesus' private life to his public ministry. As John the Baptist proclaimed at the Jordan River, "I am baptizing you with water, but one mightier than I is coming... He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire" (Luke 3:16). When Jesus emerged from the water and the Spirit descended like a dove, He wasn't just being identified as God's beloved Son; He was identifying with each of us. This feast serves as a beautiful reminder of our own baptismal call—to live as children of the light and to carry the "fire" of the Gospel into our homes, our workplaces, and our community.
