LENTEN REFLECTION FROM FATHER GODWIN

Lent is a sacred season of grace—a time the Church invites us to slow down, look within, and return wholeheartedly to the Lord. For forty days, we walk with Christ toward the Cross, trusting that the Cross always leads to Resurrection.

During these weeks, the Church calls us to three simple but powerful practices:

Prayer – Make time each day for God. Attend Sunday Mass faithfully. Consider daily Mass, Eucharistic Adoration, or praying the Stations of the Cross. Let silence create space for God's voice.

Fasting – Fasting teaches us discipline and freedom. When we deny ourselves, we discover that God alone satisfies. Offer your fasting for those who hunger physically and spiritually.

Almsgiving – Love becomes real when it is shared. Reach out to someone in need. Support our parish outreach. Forgive someone. Be intentional in acts of charity.

Lent is not about perfection. It is about direction. It is about turning again toward the Lord, no matter where we have been. If you have been away from the Sacrament of Reconciliation, this is your moment. Come home.

Pope Leo XIV's theme for this this Lenten season is "Listening and Fasting: Lent as a Time of Conversion." May we take this exhortation seriously. Lent is not merely about giving things up, but about opening our hearts. It is a season of renewal, healing, and deeper conversion as we listen and take his course of action. God does not tire of forgiving us. He waits for us with mercy. He invites us to place the mystery of God at the center of their lives, allowing the word of God to touch their hearts and renew our commitment to following Christ.





The message encourages a practical form of abstinence from harsh words and rash judgment, urging instead to cultivate kindness and respect in all aspects of life. It calls for a shared journey of listening to God and the vulnerable, fostering a community where the cry of those who suffer finds welcome and where listening opens paths towards liberation. The message is a call to make communities places where the voice of others is heard and respected, contributing to a civilization of love.

May this Lenten journey renew our families, strengthen our parish, and draw us closer to Christ. Let us walk together with hope.
"Create in me a clean heart, O God." (Psalm 51:10)

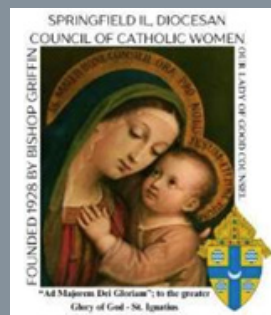

SPRINGFIELD IN IL DIOCESAN COUNCIL OF CATHOLIC WOMEN(SDCCW) SCHOLARSHIP

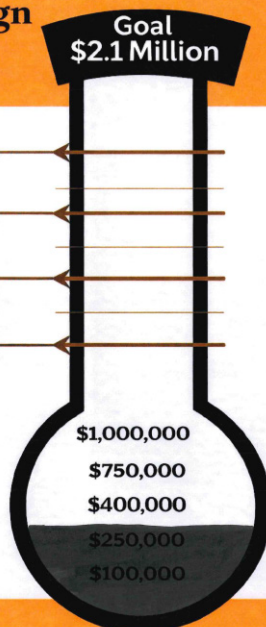

To apply for one of these scholarships, the following three documents must be received by April 15, 2026.

1. The SDCCW Scholarship Application: Completed--including your signature and the signature of your pastor.
 2. A TYPED ESSAY (two pages maximum) signed by you indicating how you have exemplified Catholic values of leadership, faith and service in your family, parish, school and/or community.
 3. A Signed LETTER OF RECOMMENDATION from an adult that is familiar with how you have exemplified Catholic values of leadership, faith and service to family, parish, school and/or community.

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE

We are hoping to raise \$2.1 million to fund many needed improvements across our campus. We kicked off this Campaign on the Feast of St. Elizabeth.

Your help is needed to achieve our goal. While we continue to look at new fundraisers where the community can participate, ultimately this is our church, our school and our campus. We need YOU praying for our success, talking up the needs of our parish, and pledging and giving, maybe even beyond your comfort level. If you do not currently tithe 10% of your gross income, this would be an excellent opportunity to ease into it through monthly payments.

Thus far, we are happy to report that we have received a total of \$280,901.00 pledged and collected \$162,107.00 in actual donations. We have a long way to go, but we are confident in our parish!

A question we have heard pertains to the amount of money that we are required to pass along to the diocese. These funds will help to maintain and improve exterior conditions at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception as well as maintenance needs at the Catholic Pastoral Center and Villa Maria Conference Center in Springfield. Our assessment amount for this campaign is \$75,456. This amount will take care of our responsibility and is a ONE TIME payment to the diocese.

Please do not pass up the opportunity to share a pledge card with your family or friends, some of whom may be alumni of our school or former parishioners. We also have a container in the gathering space for spare change or to drop contributions. Every little bit helps.

When we started the campaign, the request was for you to prayerfully consider your pledge amount. Please continue praying and discerning what you are being called to give and make your pledge soon. There are plenty of cards in the gathering space. May God bless you always.

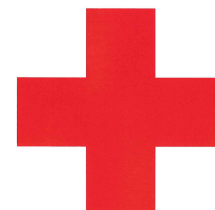
